- Lasting a long time without change.
- Enduring or able to endure over a long period of time.
- Continuing or enduring without marked change in status or condition or place.
- Existing for a long time.





## Synonyms of "Lasting" as an adjective (16 Words)

Unceasing. He had an <b>abiding</b> respect for her.
Without a break in continuity; ongoing. The act provided a <b>continuing</b> annual appropriation.
Deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held.
Very long lasting. A <b>durable</b> peace can be achieved.
Unceasing. He formed a number of <b>enduring</b> relationships with women.
Cannot be removed or erased. An <b>indelible</b> marker pen.
(used especially of ideas or principles) deeply rooted; firmly fixed or held. <i>The</i> <b>ingrained</b> <i>dirt on the flaking paintwork</i> .



<u>lifelong</u>	Continuing through life. A <b>lifelong</b> friend.
long-lasting	Existing for a long time.
long-lived	Existing for a long time.
long-term	Relating to or extending over a relatively long time.
<u>permanent</u>	Not capable of being reversed or returned to the original condition. <i>Literature of permanent value.</i>
persistent	Never-ceasing. The <b>persistent</b> gills of fishes.
persisting	Relentless and indefatigable in pursuit or as if in pursuit.
<u>remaining</u>	Still existing, present, or in use; surviving. Lilly was my last <b>remaining</b> close relative.
surviving	Remaining alive, especially after the death of another or others. There were no <b>survivina</b> relatives.

# Associations of "Lasting" (30 Words)

abiding	Lasting a long time. He had an <b>abiding</b> respect for her.
<u>ceaseless</u>	Constant and unending. The <b>ceaseless</b> thunder of surf.
changeless	Unvarying in nature. <i>Changeless</i> truths.
confirmed	(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. A <b>confirmed</b> teetotaller.
constant	(of a person) unchangingly faithful and dependable. A <b>constant</b> lover.
<u>continually</u>	Without interruption; constantly. I was <b>continually</b> moving around.
continuing	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. The act provided a <b>continuing</b> annual appropriation.
continuous	Of a function or curve; extending without break or irregularity. A <b>continuous</b> rearrangement of electrons in the solar atoms results in the emission of light.
<u>durable</u>	Existing for a long time. Porcelain enamel is strong and <b>durable</b> .



endless	(of a belt, chain, or tape) having the ends joined to form a loop allowing continuous action. We smoked <b>endless</b> cigarettes.
<u>enduring</u>	Unceasing. He formed a number of <b>enduring</b> relationships with women.
equable	Not varying or fluctuating greatly. <i>He could look sterner than his <b>equable</b> temperament would suggest.</i>
eternity	Endless life after death. Symbolic inklings of <b>eternity</b> .
everlasting	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>The damned would suffer everlasting torment.</i>
immutable	Constant and unchanging. The view of that time was that all species were <b>immutable</b> created by God.
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
incessantly	With unflagging resolve. She talked about him <b>incessantly</b> .
indelible	Not able to be forgotten. The story made an <b>indelible</b> impression on me.
indestructible	Very long lasting. <i>Indestructible</i> plastic containers.
ineradicable	Not able to be destroyed or rooted out. <i>Ineradicable</i> hostility.
invariable	(of a quantity) constant. An <b>invariable</b> rule.
permanence	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration. <i>The clarity and <b>permanence</b> of the dyes.</i>
permanency	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<u>permanent</u>	Lasting or continuing without interruption. <b>Permanent</b> address.
perpetual	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. A <b>perpetual</b> secretary of the society.
<u>stable</u>	Shelter in a stable. The economy is <b>stable</b> .
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.
