most recent	The superlative of `much' that can be used with mass nouns and is usually preceded by `the'; a quantifier meaning the greatest in amount or extent or degree.
newest	Other than the former one(s); different.
present-day	Belonging to the present time.
state-of-the-art	The highest level of development at a particular time (especially the present time).
up to date	Used up.
up to the minute	Being or moving higher in position or greater in some value; being above a former position or level.
up-to-the-minute	Up to the immediate present; most recent or most up-to-date.

leaning	The property possessed by a line or surface that departs from the vertical. <i>He felt leanings toward frivolity.</i>
modern	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>The pace of modern life.</i>
modernity	The quality of being current or of the present. <i>A shopping mall would instill a spirit of modernity into this village.</i>
modish	In the current fashion or style. <i>It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this modish jargon.</i>
newly	Very recently. <i>A newly acquired hi fi system.</i>
nowadays	The period of time that is happening now; any continuous stretch of time including the moment of speech. <i>The sort of clothes worn by almost all young people nowadays.</i>
present	Represent abstractly for example in a painting drawing or sculpture. <i>He lives in the present with no thought of tomorrow.</i>
presently	After a short time; soon. <i>She will arrive presently.</i>
recency	A time immediately before the present.
recent	The Holocene epoch. <i>A recent edition of the newspaper.</i>
