- *So unreasonable as to invite derision.*

Synonyms of "Laughable" as an adjective (23 Words)

absurd	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>It may look absurd but having a treadmill desk could improve your attention span.</i>
amusing	Providing enjoyment; pleasantly entertaining. <i>An amusing speaker.</i>
cockeyed	Turned or twisted toward one side- G.K.Chesterton. <i>Do you expect us to believe a cockeyed story like that.</i>

comic	Causing or meant to cause laughter. Comic drama.
comical	Amusing, especially in a ludicrous or absurd way. A comical look of surprise.
derisory	Ridiculously small or inadequate. They were given a derisory pay rise.
<u>diverting</u>	Entertaining or amusing. A diverting story.
droll	Comical in an odd or whimsical manner. A droll little man with a quiet tongue in cheek kind of humor.
<u>entertaining</u>	Agreeably diverting. An entertaining puppet show.
farcical	Relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects. The wild farcical exuberance of a clown.
funny	Arousing or provoking laughter. There was something funny going on.
<u>hilarious</u>	Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter. Hilarious broad comedy.
humorous	Causing laughter and amusement; comic. Humorous stories.
<u>idiotic</u>	Insanely irresponsible. An idiotic idea.
<u>irrational</u>	Of a number quantity or expression not expressible as a ratio of two integers and having an infinite and non recurring expansion when expressed as a decimal Examples of irrational numbers are the number and the square root of 2. Irrational feelings of hostility.
<u>ludicrous</u>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. Ludicrous green hair.
mirthful	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment. A mirthful laugh.
nonsensical	Ridiculously impractical or ill-advised. A nonsensical argument.
preposterous	So unreasonable as to invite derision. A preposterous attempt to turn back the pages of history.

ridiculous	Broadly or extravagantly humorous; resembling farce. <i>That ridiculous tartan cap.</i>
risible	Provoking laughter through being ludicrous. <i>Risible courtroom antics.</i>
uproarious	Characterized by or provoking loud noise or uproar. <i>An uproarious party.</i>
worthy of scorn	Having worth or merit or value; being honorable or admirable.

Usage Examples of "Laughable" as an adjective

- *It would have been laughable if it hadn't hurt so much.*
- *If it didn't make me so angry it would be laughable.*
- *A contribution so small as to be laughable.*

absurd	An absurd state of affairs. <i>The incidents that followed bordered on the absurd.</i>
amusing	Causing laughter and providing entertainment. <i>An amusing film with a steady stream of pranks and pratfalls.</i>
<u>comedy</u>	The style or genre represented by comedy films plays and broadcast programmes. <i>Satiric comedy.</i>
comical	Amusing, especially in a ludicrous or absurd way. <i>A comical look of surprise.</i>
derisive	Expressing contempt or ridicule. <i>He gave a harsh derisive laugh.</i>
droll	Curious or unusual in a way that provokes dry amusement. <i>His unique brand of droll self mockery.</i>
<u>entertaining</u>	Providing amusement or enjoyment. <i>A charming and entertaining companion.</i>
<u>exhilaration</u>	The feeling of lively and cheerful joy. <i>They felt the exhilaration of victory.</i>
farcical	Relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects. <i>The wild farcical exuberance of a clown.</i>

fun	A source of fun. <i>The column s just a bit of fun.</i>
funny	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>Suddenly my stomach felt funny.</i>
goofy	A cartoon character created by Walt Disney. <i>Wore a goofy hat.</i>
hilarious	Extremely amusing. <i>Her hilarious novel.</i>
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>You can t survive in the army without a sense of humor.</i>
humorous	Causing laughter and amusement; comic. <i>In a humorous vein.</i>
idiotic	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>I was able to hum its idiotic theme tune.</i>
jesting	Characterized by jokes and good humor. <i>Laughing and jesting were out of the question.</i>
jocose	Playful or humorous. <i>A jocose allusion.</i>
jocular	Characterized by jokes and good humor. <i>They tried to deal with this painful subject jocularly.</i>
ludicrous	So foolish, unreasonable, or out of place as to be amusing. <i>Ludicrous green hair.</i>
preposterous	Contrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous. <i>A preposterous suggestion.</i>
quirky	(informal) strikingly unconventional. <i>Her sense of humour was decidedly quirky.</i>
repartee	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>Quick fire repartee.</i>
ridiculous	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>That ridiculous tartan cap.</i>
risible	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>A risible scene of lovemaking in a tent.</i>
satiric	Exposing human folly to ridicule. <i>A persistent campaign of mockery by the satirical fortnightly magazine.</i>
skit	A short comedy sketch or piece of humorous writing, especially a parody. <i>Students will create skits about bullying and go to each elementary school to perform them.</i>

slapstick

Acoustic device consisting of two paddles hinged together; used by an actor to make a loud noise without inflicting injury when striking someone.

***Slapstick** style of humor.*

whimsical

Acting or behaving in a capricious manner.

*The **whimsical** arbitrariness of autocracy.*

witty

Showing or characterized by quick and inventive verbal humour.

*His sermons were unpredictably **witty** and satirical as well as eloquent.*
