### Definitions of "Laughable" as an adjective

- *Incongruous;inviting ridicule.*
- *Arousing or provoking laughter.*
- *So ludicrous as to be amusing.*
- *So unreasonable as to invite derision.*

### Synonyms of "Laughable" as an adjective (23 Words)

<b>absurd</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>It may look <b>absurd</b> but having a treadmill desk could improve your attention span.</i>
<b>amusing</b>	Providing enjoyment; pleasantly entertaining. <i>An <b>amusing</b> speaker.</i>
<b>cockeyed</b>	Turned or twisted toward one side- G.K.Chesterton. <i>Do you expect us to believe a <b>cockeyed</b> story like that.</i>

<b>comic</b>	Causing or meant to cause laughter. <b>Comic drama.</b>
<b>comical</b>	Amusing, especially in a ludicrous or absurd way. A <b>comical</b> look of surprise.
<b>derisory</b>	Ridiculously small or inadequate. They were given a <b>derisory</b> pay rise.
<b><u>diverting</u></b>	Entertaining or amusing. A <b>diverting</b> story.
<b>droll</b>	Comical in an odd or whimsical manner. A <b>droll</b> little man with a quiet tongue in cheek kind of humor.
<b><u>entertaining</u></b>	Agreeably diverting. An <b>entertaining</b> puppet show.
<b>farcical</b>	Relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects. The wild <b>farcical</b> exuberance of a clown.
<b>funny</b>	Arousing or provoking laughter. There was something <b>funny</b> going on.
<b><u>hilarious</u></b>	Marked by or causing boisterous merriment or convulsive laughter. <b>Hilarious</b> broad comedy.
<b>humorous</b>	Causing laughter and amusement; comic. <b>Humorous</b> stories.
<b><u>idiotic</u></b>	Insanely irresponsible. An <b>idiotic</b> idea.
<b><u>irrational</u></b>	Of a number quantity or expression not expressible as a ratio of two integers and having an infinite and non recurring expansion when expressed as a decimal Examples of irrational numbers are the number and the square root of 2. <b>Irrational</b> feelings of hostility.
<b><u>ludicrous</u></b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <b>Ludicrous</b> green hair.
<b>mirthful</b>	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment. A <b>mirthful</b> laugh.
<b>nonsensical</b>	Ridiculously impractical or ill-advised. A <b>nonsensical</b> argument.
<b>preposterous</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. A <b>preposterous</b> attempt to turn back the pages of history.

<b>ridiculous</b>	Broadly or extravagantly humorous; resembling farce. <i>That <b>ridiculous</b> tartan cap.</i>
<b>risible</b>	Provoking laughter through being ludicrous. <i><b>Risible</b> courtroom antics.</i>
<b>uproarious</b>	Characterized by or provoking loud noise or uproar. <i>An <b>uproarious</b> party.</i>
<b>worthy of scorn</b>	Having worth or merit or value; being honorable or admirable.

### Usage Examples of "Laughable" as an adjective

- *It would have been laughable if it hadn't hurt so much.*
- *If it didn't make me so angry it would be laughable.*
- *A contribution so small as to be laughable.*

### Associations of "Laughable" (30 Words)

<b>absurd</b>	An absurd state of affairs. <i>The incidents that followed bordered on the <b>absurd</b>.</i>
<b>amusing</b>	Causing laughter and providing entertainment. <i>An <b>amusing</b> film with a steady stream of pranks and pratfalls.</i>
<b>comedy</b>	The style or genre represented by comedy films plays and broadcast programmes. <i>Satiric <b>comedy</b>.</i>
<b>comical</b>	Amusing, especially in a ludicrous or absurd way. <i>A <b>comical</b> look of surprise.</i>
<b>derisive</b>	Expressing contempt or ridicule. <i>He gave a harsh <b>derisive</b> laugh.</i>
<b>droll</b>	Curious or unusual in a way that provokes dry amusement. <i>His unique brand of <b>droll</b> self mockery.</i>
<b>entertaining</b>	Providing amusement or enjoyment. <i>A charming and <b>entertaining</b> companion.</i>
<b>exhilaration</b>	The feeling of lively and cheerful joy. <i>They felt the <b>exhilaration</b> of victory.</i>
<b>farcical</b>	Relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects. <i>The wild <b>farcical</b> exuberance of a clown.</i>

<b>fun</b>	A source of fun. <i>The column s just a bit of <b>fun</b>.</i>
<b>funny</b>	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>Suddenly my stomach felt <b>funny</b>.</i>
<b>goofy</b>	A cartoon character created by Walt Disney. <i>Wore a <b>goofy</b> hat.</i>
<b>hilarious</b>	Extremely amusing. <i>Her <b>hilarious</b> novel.</i>
<b>humor</b>	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>You can t survive in the army without a sense of <b>humor</b>.</i>
<b>humorous</b>	Causing laughter and amusement; comic. <i>In a <b>humorous</b> vein.</i>
<b>idiotic</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>I was able to hum its <b>idiotic</b> theme tune.</i>
<b>jesting</b>	Characterized by jokes and good humor. <i>Laughing and <b>jesting</b> were out of the question.</i>
<b>jocose</b>	Playful or humorous. <i>A <b>jocose</b> allusion.</i>
<b>jocular</b>	Characterized by jokes and good humor. <i>They tried to deal with this painful subject <b>jocularly</b>.</i>
<b>ludicrous</b>	So foolish, unreasonable, or out of place as to be amusing. <i><b>Ludicrous</b> green hair.</i>
<b>preposterous</b>	Contrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous. <i>A <b>preposterous</b> suggestion.</i>
<b>quirky</b>	(informal) strikingly unconventional. <i>Her sense of humour was decidedly <b>quirky</b>.</i>
<b>repartee</b>	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>Quick fire <b>repartee</b>.</i>
<b>ridiculous</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>That <b>ridiculous</b> tartan cap.</i>
<b>risible</b>	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>A <b>risible</b> scene of lovemaking in a tent.</i>
<b>satiric</b>	Exposing human folly to ridicule. <i>A persistent campaign of mockery by the <b>satirical</b> fortnightly magazine.</i>
<b>skit</b>	A short comedy sketch or piece of humorous writing, especially a parody. <i>Students will create <b>skits</b> about bullying and go to each elementary school to perform them.</i>

- slapstick** Acoustic device consisting of two paddles hinged together; used by an actor to make a loud noise without inflicting injury when striking someone.  
***Slapstick** style of humor.*

*The **whimsical** arbitrariness of autocracy.*
