## Associations of "Laughed" (30 Words)

<a href="#">amusement</a>	An activity that is diverting and that holds the attention. <i>An evening s <b>amusement</b>.</i>
<a href="#">badinage</a>	Frivolous banter. <i>He developed a nice line in <b>badinage</b> with the Labour leader.</i>
<a href="#">banter</a>	Light teasing repartee. <i>The men <b>bantered</b> with the waitresses.</i>
<a href="#">buffoonery</a>	Acting like a clown or buffoon. <i>The film is full of wordplay and <b>buffoonery</b>.</i>
<a href="#">comedy</a>	The style or genre represented by comedy films plays and broadcast programmes. <i>Satiric <b>comedy</b>.</i>
<a href="#">exhilaration</a>	A feeling of excitement, happiness, or elation. <i>They felt the <b>exhilaration</b> of victory.</i>
<a href="#">fun</a>	A source of fun. <i>Being on set with the cast and crew was really <b>fun</b>.</i>
<a href="#">funny</a>	Unusual, especially in such a way as to arouse suspicion. <i>Up to some <b>funny</b> business.</i>
<a href="#">gaiety</a>	A gay feeling. <i>He seemed to be a part of the <b>gaiety</b> having a wonderful time.</i>
<a href="#">glee</a>	A song for men’s voices in three or more parts, usually unaccompanied, of a type popular especially c.1750–1830. <i>His face lit up with impish <b>glee</b>.</i>
<a href="#">hilarious</a>	Boisterously merry. <i>The meal was noisy and <b>hilarious</b>.</i>
<a href="#">hilarity</a>	Boisterous merriment. <i>By midnight the <b>hilarity</b> had increased.</i>

<b>humor</b>	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>She didn't appreciate my <b>humor</b>.</i>
<b>humorous</b>	Full of or characterized by humor. <i>A <b>humorous</b> and entertaining talk.</i>
<b>humour</b>	The ability to express humour or amuse other people. <i>His tales are full of <b>humour</b>.</i>
<b>jape</b>	Say or do something in jest or mockery. <i>The childish <b>jape</b> of depositing a stink bomb in her locker.</i>
<b>jest</b>	Act in a funny or teasing way. <i>He laughed uproariously at his own <b>jest</b>.</i>
<b>jocose</b>	Characterized by jokes and good humor. <i>A <b>jocose</b> allusion.</i>
<b>jocular</b>	Fond of or characterized by joking; humorous or playful. <i>She sounded in a <b>jocular</b> mood.</i>
<a href="#">joke</a>	Tell a joke speak humorously. <i>She could laugh and <b>joke</b> with her colleagues.</i>
<a href="#">jolly</a>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>The <b>jolly</b> crowd at the reunion.</i>
<b>laughing</b>	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i><b>Laughing</b> children.</i>
<a href="#">merry</a>	Slightly and good-humouredly drunk. <i>A <b>merry</b> evening.</i>
<b>mirth</b>	Amusement, especially as expressed in laughter. <i>His six foot frame shook with <b>mirth</b>.</i>
<b>repartee</b>	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>Quick fire <b>repartee</b>.</i>
<b>simper</b>	Smile affectedly or derisively. <i>She <b>simpered</b> looking pleased with herself.</i>
<b>slapstick</b>	A boisterous comedy with chases and collisions and practical jokes. <i><b>Slapstick</b> humour.</i>
<b>smile</b>	Express with a smile. <i>She greeted us all with a <b>smile</b>.</i>
<a href="#">snicker</a>	A half-suppressed, typically scornful laugh; a snigger. <i>She is a woman they all love to <b>snicker</b> at.</i>
<b>witticism</b>	A witty remark. <i>Maurice roared with laughter at his own <b>witticisms</b>.</i>
