- A rule or body of rules of conduct inherent in human nature and essential to or binding upon human society.
- The first of three divisions of the Hebrew Scriptures comprising the first five books of the Hebrew Bible considered as a unit.
- The force of policemen and officers.
- Legal document setting forth rules governing a particular kind of activity.
- A generalization that describes recurring facts or events in nature.
- The learned profession that is mastered by graduate study in a law school and that is responsible for the judicial system.
- The collection of rules imposed by authority.
- The branch of philosophy concerned with the law and the principles that lead courts to make the decisions they do.
