Definitions of "Laws" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “laws” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A rule or body of rules of conduct inherent in human nature and essential to or binding upon human society.*
- *The first of three divisions of the Hebrew Scriptures comprising the first five books of the Hebrew Bible considered as a unit.*
- *The force of policemen and officers.*
- *Legal document setting forth rules governing a particular kind of activity.*
- *A generalization that describes recurring facts or events in nature.*
- *The learned profession that is mastered by graduate study in a law school and that is responsible for the judicial system.*
- *The collection of rules imposed by authority.*
- *The branch of philosophy concerned with the law and the principles that lead courts to make the decisions they do.*



Synonyms of "Laws" as a noun (2 Words)

- pentateuch** The first of three divisions of the Hebrew Scriptures comprising the first five books of the Hebrew Bible considered as a unit.
- torah** (Judaism) the scroll of parchment on which the first five books of the Hebrew Scripture is written; is used in a synagogue during services.

<u>constitutional</u>	Constitutional in the structure of something especially your physical makeup. <i>A constitutional amendment.</i>
court	The place where a court meets. <i>A court case.</i>
courtroom	The place or room in which a court of law meets. <i>Television cameras were admitted in the courtroom.</i>
<u>crime</u>	Illegal activities. <i>The victims of crime.</i>

docket	Place on the docket for legal action. <i>The clothes would be handed in and neatly docketed.</i>
enactment	The controlled expression and acceptance of repressed emotions or impulses in behaviour during therapy. <i>The story becomes an enactment of his fantasies.</i>
felony	A serious crime (such as murder or arson). <i>An accusation of felony.</i>
illegal	Contrary to or forbidden by law, especially criminal law. <i>Illegal drugs.</i>
<u>indict</u>	Accuse formally of a crime. <i>His former manager was indicted for fraud.</i>
judicial	Belonging or appropriate to the office of a judge. <i>Judicial system.</i>
jurisdiction	A system of law courts; a judicature. <i>Several different tax jurisdictions.</i>
killing	An act of causing death, especially deliberately. <i>A killing disease.</i>
lawsuit	A comprehensive term for any proceeding in a court of law whereby an individual seeks a legal remedy. <i>His lawyer filed a lawsuit against Los Angeles city.</i>
<u>lawyer</u>	Practise law work as a lawyer. <i>Lawyering is a craft that takes a long time to become proficient at.</i>
legal	Relating to theological legalism. <i>The European legal system.</i>
legitimately	In a way that can be defended with logic or justification; fairly. <i>Nobody can legitimately argue that he didn't pay his dues.</i>
<u>liability</u>	A thing for which someone is responsible, especially an amount of money owed. <i>She said the party had become a liability to green politics.</i>
litigation	The process of taking legal action. <i>The company wishes to avoid litigation.</i>
malpractice	A wrongful act that the actor had no right to do; improper professional conduct. <i>Victims of medical malpractice.</i>
<u>penalty</u>	A punishment imposed for breaking a law, rule, or contract. <i>The charge carries a maximum penalty of ten years imprisonment.</i>

plaintiff	A person who brings a case against another in a court of law. <i>The plaintiff commenced an action for damages.</i>
probate	The act of proving that an instrument purporting to be a will was signed and executed in accord with legal requirements. <i>The house has been valued for probate.</i>
proceeding	(law) the institution of a sequence of steps by which legal judgments are invoked.
tort	A wrongful act or an infringement of a right (other than under contract) leading to legal liability. <i>The law of tort.</i>
<u>trial</u>	Of a horse dog or other animal compete in trials. <i>Teachers all over the UK are trialling the materials.</i>
<u>valid</u>	(of an argument or point) having a sound basis in logic or fact; reasonable or cogent. <i>A valid argument.</i>
verdict	The findings of a jury on issues of fact submitted to it for decision; can be used in formulating a judgment. <i>This seems a fair verdict on the tabloids.</i>
wanted	Characterized by feeling or showing fond affection for. <i>So good to feel wanted.</i>
