Definitions of "Layer" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “layer” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person or thing that lays something.*
- *A shoot fastened down to take root while attached to the parent plant.*
- *Single thickness of usually some homogeneous substance.*
- *A sheet, quantity, or thickness of material, typically one of several, covering a surface or body.*
- *An abstract place usually conceived as having depth.*
- *A hen that lays eggs.*
- *A relatively thin sheetlike expanse or region lying over or under another.*
- *A level of seniority in the hierarchy of an organization.*
- *Thin structure composed of a single thickness of cells.*

- bed** A place on the seabed where shellfish especially oysters or mussels breed or are bred.
*The room had only a **bed** and chair.*
- blanket** Bedding that keeps a person warm in bed.
*I slept on the ground covered by my **blanket**.*
- coat** The skin or husk of a fruit or seed.
*A winter **coat**.*
- coating** A decorative texture or appearance of a surface (or the substance that gives it that appearance).
*The surface was ready for a **coating** of paint.*

- covering** The act of protecting something by covering it.
*A vinyl floor **covering**.*
- film** A form of entertainment that enacts a story by sound and a sequence of images giving the illusion of continuous movement.
*A critical overview of feminist writing on **film**.*
- level** An abstract place usually conceived as having depth.
*What **level** is the office on.*
- sheet** A quantity of text or other information contained on a sheet of paper.
*The rain was still falling in **sheets**.*
- [skin](#) A strip of sealskin or other material attached to the underside of a ski to prevent a skier slipping backwards during climbing.
*Victoria was skimming the **skin** off the saucepan of milk.*
- stratum** One of several parallel layers of material arranged one on top of another (such as a layer of tissue or cells in an organism or a layer of sedimentary rock).
*A **stratum** of flint.*
- [surface](#) The extended two-dimensional outer boundary of a three-dimensional object.
*Fish floating on the **surface** of the water.*
- thickness** The dimension through an object as opposed to its length or width.
*The gateway is several feet in **thickness**.*
- [veneer](#) A crown in which the restoration is placed over the prepared surface of a natural crown.
*The ceiling was of maple **veneer**.*



Usage Examples of "Layer" as a noun

- *A managerial layer.*
- *Arrange a layer of aubergines in a dish.*

- aquifer** A body of permeable rock which can contain or transmit groundwater.
- bedrock** Principles from which other truths can be derived.
*Honesty is the **bedrock** of a good relationship.*
- boundary** A line which marks the limits of an area; a dividing line.
*The river marks the **boundary** between the two regions.*
- caste** The system of dividing society into castes.
*A man of high **caste**.*
- compost** Convert to compost.
*Cover with a layer of fine **compost**.*
- convection** The movement caused within a fluid by the tendency of hotter and therefore less dense material to rise, and colder, denser material to sink under the influence of gravity, which consequently results in transfer of heat.
*The final transfer of energy to the surface is by **convection**.*

cumulative	Increasing by successive addition. <i>The benefits are cumulative.</i>
cuticle	A protective and waxy or hard layer covering the epidermis of a plant, invertebrate, or shell. <i>You've been gnawing at your cuticles.</i>
dermis	The thick layer of living tissue below the epidermis which forms the true skin containing blood capillaries nerve endings sweat glands hair follicles and other structures.
epidermis	The surface epithelium of the skin, overlying the dermis.
hierarchic	Classified according to various criteria into successive levels or layers. <i>In her hierarchic set of values honesty comes first.</i>
humus	A thick spread made from mashed chickpeas, tahini, lemon juice and garlic; used especially as a dip for pita; originated in the Middle East.
integument	An outer protective covering such as the skin of an animal or a cuticle or seed coat or rind or shell. <i>This chemical compound is found in the integument of the seed.</i>
level	Become level or even. <i>A high level of unemployment.</i>
mantle	The part of another planetary body corresponding to the earth's mantle. <i>The ivy mantles the building.</i>
manure	Apply manure to land. <i>The ground should be well dug and manured.</i>
outer	An outer garment or part of one. <i>The outer suburbs.</i>
ozone	A colorless gas (O ₃) soluble in alkalis and cold water; a strong oxidizing agent; can be produced by electric discharge in oxygen or by the action of ultraviolet radiation on oxygen in the stratosphere (where it acts as a screen for ult.
peeling	Loss of bits of outer skin by peeling or shedding or coming off in scales.
soil	Make soiled filthy or dirty. <i>American troops were stationed on Japanese soil.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stratify	Of seeds be germinated by stratifying. <i>The residues have begun to stratify.</i>

stratigraphy	The branch of geology concerned with the order and relative position of strata and their relationship to the geological timescale. <i>You can find materials at the surface which are samples from the deeper stratigraphy.</i>
stratum	A group into which members of a population are divided in stratified sampling. <i>A stratum of flint.</i>
<u>substrate</u>	A material which provides the surface on which something is deposited or inscribed, for example the silicon wafer used to manufacture integrated circuits. <i>The Celtic languages of Britain are a substrate for English.</i>
substratum	A surface on which an organism grows or is attached. <i>A geological substratum.</i>
<u>tier</u>	Each in a series of rows or levels of a structure placed one above the other. <i>Tier upon tier of huge casks.</i>
<u>topography</u>	A detailed description or representation on a map of the physical features of an area. <i>The topography of the island.</i>
topsoil	The layer of soil on the surface. <i>Keep all the topsoil you remove you re bound to find a use for it later.</i>
<u>underlie</u>	Lie underneath. <i>Limestone underlies much of the site.</i>
