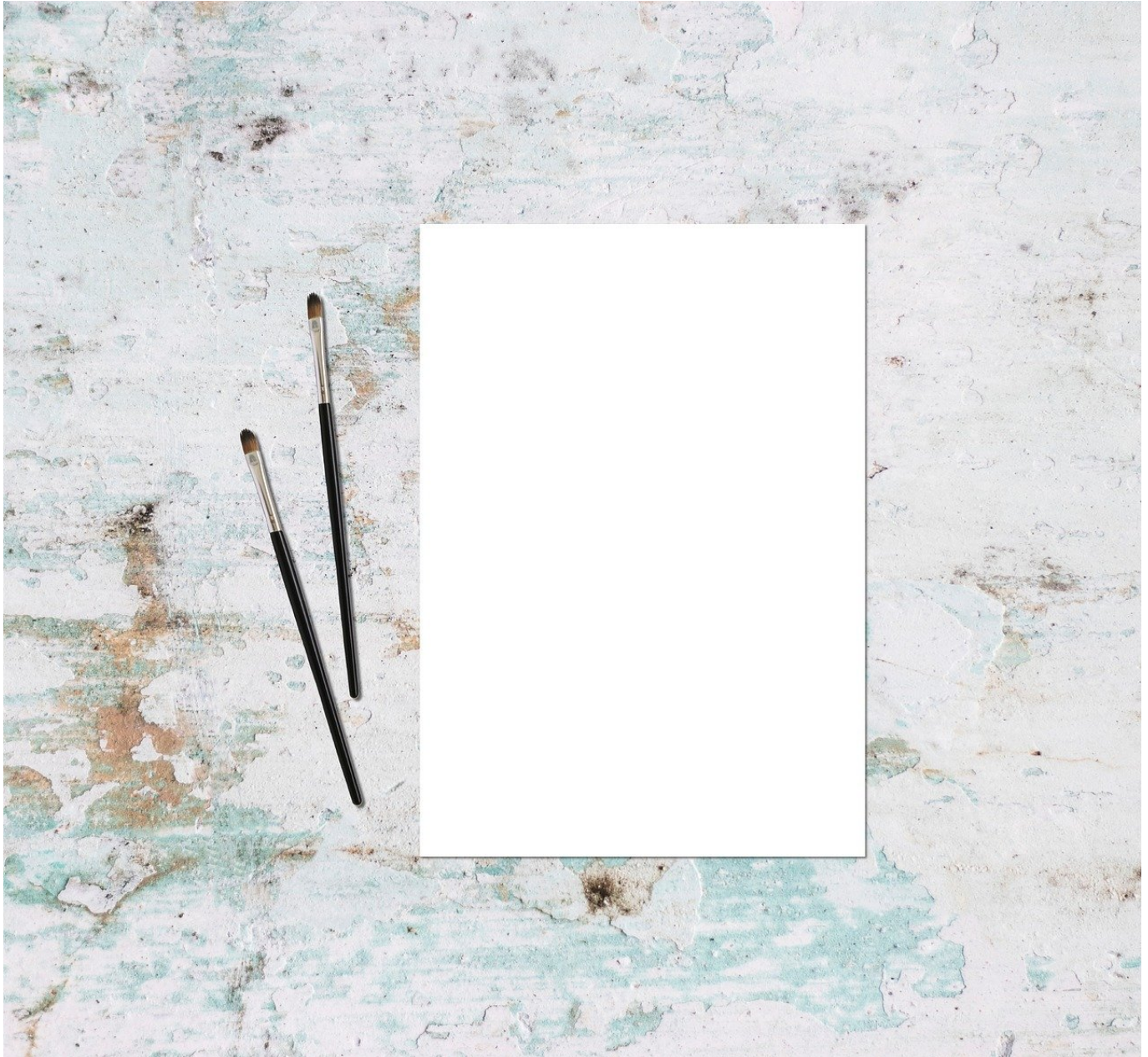
- arrangement** A musical composition arranged for performance with instruments or voices differing from those originally specified.

| <b>exhibit</b>              | An exhibition.<br><i>He <b>exhibits</b> a great talent.</i>  |
| <b>extra</b>                | Excessive or extravagant.<br><i>An <b>extra</b> pair of shoes.</i>   |
| <b>extraneous</b>           | Coming from the outside.<br><i>When the transmitter pack is turned off no <b>extraneous</b> noise is heard.</i>  |
| <b><u>gallery</u></b>       | A balcony or upper floor projecting from an interior back or side wall of a hall or church, providing space for an audience or musicians.<br><i>An art <b>gallery</b>.</i>       |
| <b>glut</b>                 | Overeat or eat immodestly; make a pig of oneself.<br><i>He planned a treacherous murder to <b>glut</b> his desire for revenge.</i>   |
| <b>grid</b>                 | A grid of regular squares on a map that are marked with numbers or letters to enable a place to be precisely located.<br><i>The fen is <b>gridded</b> by intersecting dykes.</i> |
| <b>needless</b>             | (of something undesirable) not necessary because avoidable.<br><i>I deplore <b>needless</b> waste.</i>   |
| <b>oversupply</b>           | An excessive supply.<br><i><b>Oversupply</b> causes prices to fall.</i>  |
| <b>permissive</b>           | Denoting a path available for public use by the landowner's consent, not as a legal right of way.<br><i><b>Permissive</b> parents.</i>   |

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| <b>planned</b>        | Planned in advance.<br><i>The <b>planned</b> outlays for new equipment.</i>   |
| <b>plethora</b>       | An excess of a bodily fluid, particularly blood.<br><i>Allen won a <b>plethora</b> of medals during his illustrious career.</i>   |
| <b>redundance</b>     | The attribute of being superfluous and unneeded.  |
| <b>redundancy</b>     | The state of being no longer in employment because there is no more work available.<br><i>The use of industrial robots created <b>redundancy</b> among workers.</i>                       |
| <b>redundant</b>      | (of words or data) able to be omitted without loss of meaning or function.<br><i>The modules are linked using a <b>redundant</b> fibre optic cable.</i>                                   |
| <b>supererogatory</b> | More than is needed, desired, or required.<br><i>It was <b>supererogatory</b> of her to gloat.</i>  |
| <b>superfluity</b>    | An unnecessarily or excessively large amount or number of something.<br><i>They thought the garrison a <b>superfluity</b>.</i>  |
| <b>superfluous</b>    | More than is needed, desired, or required.<br><i>The purchaser should avoid asking for <b>superfluous</b> information.</i>  |
| <b>supernumerary</b>  | A supernumerary person or thing.<br><i>Books were obviously <b>supernumerary</b> and he began jettisoning them.</i>   |
| <b>surfeit</b>        | Supply or feed to surfeit.<br><i>A <b>surfeit</b> of food and drink.</i>  |
| <b>surplus</b>        | An amount of something left over when requirements have been met; an excess of production or supply.<br><i>The firm told 284 employees that they were <b>surplus</b> to requirements.</i> |
| <b>unnecessary</b>    | Unnecessary things.<br><i>Some people feel that holiday insurance is <b>unnecessary</b>.</i>  |
