Infinitive	to lean
Present Tense	lean / leans
Past Tense	leaned or leant (especially british)
Present Participle	leaning
Past Participle	leaned or leant (especially british)

Conjugate Lean

Lean in Present Simple (Indefinite) Tense

Singular	Plural
I lean	We lean
You lean	You lean
He/She/It leans	They lean

Lean in Present Continuous (Progressive) Tense

Singular	Plural
I am leaning	We are leaning
You are leaning	You are leaning
He/She/It is leaning	They are leaning

Lean in Present Perfect Tense

Singular	Plural
I have leaned or leant (especially british)	We have leaned or leant (especially british)
You have leaned or leant (especially british)	You have leaned or leant (especially british)
He/She/It has leaned or leant (especially british)	They have leaned or leant (especially british)

Lean in Present Perfect Continuous Tense

Singular	Plural
I have been leaning	We have been leaning
You have been leaning	You have been leaning
He/She/It has been leaning	They have been leaning

Lean in Past Simple (Indefinite) Tense

Singular	Plural
I leaned or leant (especially british)	We leaned or leant (especially british)
You leaned or leant (especially british)	You leaned or leant (especially british)
He/She/It leaned or leant (especially british)	They leaned or leant (especially british)

Lean in Past Continuous (Progressive) Tense

Singular

I was leaning

You were leaning

He/She/It was leaning

Plural

We were leaning

You were leaning

They were leaning

Lean in Past Perfect Tense

Singular

I had leaned or leant (especially british)

You had leaned or leant (especially british)

He/She/It had leaned or leant (especially british)

Plural

We had leaned or leant (especially british)

You had leaned or leant (especially british)

They had leaned or leant (especially british)

Lean in Past Perfect Continuous Tense

Singular

I had been leaning

You had been leaning

He/She/It had been leaning

Plural

We had been leaning

You had been leaning

They had been leaning

Lean in Future Simple (Indefinite) Tense

Singular

I will lean

You will lean

He/She/It will lean

Plural

We will lean

You will lean

They will lean

Lean in Future Continuous (Progressive) Tense

Singular

I will be leaning

You will be leaning

Plural

We will be leaning

You will be leaning

Singular

Plural

He/She/It **will be leaning** They **will be leaning**

Lean in Future Perfect Tense

Singular

Plural

I **will have leaned or leant (especially british)**

We **will have leaned or leant (especially british)**

You **will have leaned or leant (especially british)**

You **will have leaned or leant (especially british)**

He/She/It **will have leaned or leant (especially british)**

They **will have leaned or leant (especially british)**

Lean in Future Perfect Continuous Tense

Singular

Plural

I **will have been leaning**

We **will have been leaning**

You **will have been leaning**

You **will have been leaning**

He/She/It **will have been leaning** They **will have been leaning**
