### Lean in Present Simple (Indefinite) Tense



Singular	Plural
I <b>lean</b>	We <b>lean</b>
You <b>lean</b>	You <b>lean</b>
He/She/It <b>leans</b>	They <b>lean</b>

# Lean in Present Continuous (Progressive) Tense

Singular	Plural
I <b>am leaning</b>	We are leaning
You <b>are leaning</b>	You <b>are leaning</b>
He/She/It is leaning	They <b>are leaning</b>

#### Lean in Present Perfect Tense

Singular	Plural
I have leaned or leant (especially british)	We <b>have leaned or leant (especially british)</b>
You <b>have leaned or leant (especially</b>	You <b>have leaned or leant (especially</b>
<b>british)</b>	<b>british)</b>
He/She/It <b>has leaned or leant (especially</b>	They <b>have leaned or leant (especially</b>
<b>british)</b>	<b>british)</b>

## Lean in Present Perfect Continuous Tense

Singular	Plural
I have been leaning	We have been leaning
You <b>have been leaning</b>	You have been leaning
He/She/It has been leaning	They have been leaning

# Lean in Past Simple (Indefinite) Tense

Singular	Plural
I leaned or leant (especially british)	We leaned or leant (especially british)
You <b>leaned or leant (especially british)</b>	You <b>leaned or leant (especially british)</b>
He/She/It <b>leaned or leant (especially</b> <b>british)</b>	They leaned or leant (especially british)



# Lean in Past Continuous (Progressive) Tense

Singular	Plural
I was leaning	We <b>were leaning</b>
You <b>were leaning</b>	You <b>were leaning</b>
He/She/It was leaning	They were leaning

#### Lean in Past Perfect Tense

Singular	Plural
I had leaned or leant (especially british)	We <b>had leaned or leant (especially</b> <b>british)</b>
You <b>had leaned or leant (especially</b> british)	You <b>had leaned or leant (especially</b> <b>british)</b>
He/She/It had leaned or leant (especially british)	They <b>had leaned or leant (especially british)</b>

#### Lean in Past Perfect Continuous Tense

Singular	Plural
I had been leaning	We had been leaning
You <b>had been leaning</b>	You had been leaning
He/She/It had been leaning	They had been leaning

# Lean in Future Simple (Indefinite) Tense

Singular	Plural
I will lean	We <b>will lean</b>
You <b>will lean</b>	You <b>will lean</b>
He/She/It will lean	They will lean

### Lean in Future Continuous (Progressive) Tense

Singular	Plural
I will be leaning	We <b>will be leaning</b>
You <b>will be leaning</b>	You <b>will be leaning</b>

## Lean in Future Perfect Tense

Singular	Plural
I will have leaned or leant (especially british)	We <b>will have leaned or leant (especially british)</b>
You <b>will have leaned or leant (especially</b> <b>british)</b>	You <b>will have leaned or leant (especially</b> <b>british)</b>
He/She/It <b>will have leaned or leant</b> (especially british)	They <b>will have leaned or leant (especially british)</b>

# Lean in Future Perfect Continuous Tense

Singular	Plural
I will have been leaning	We <b>will have been leaning</b>
You <b>will have been leaning</b>	You <b>will have been leaning</b>
He/She/It will have been leaning	They will have been leaning
