<u>angle</u>	Move or be inclined at an angle. <i>He always had a fresh <b>angle</b> on life.</i>
axis	A fixed reference line for the measurement of coordinates. The leaflets are arranged in rows on a slender <b>axis</b> .
banister	The structure formed by the uprights and handrail at the side of a staircase. <i>She peered over the banisters.</i>
bend	A kind of knot used to join two ropes together or to tie a rope to another object e g a carrick bend. The van screeched round a <b>bend</b> .
bending	The act of bending something.
<u>bow</u>	Play on a string instrument with a bow. A girl with long hair tied back in a <b>bow</b> .
condescend	Treat condescendingly. He <b>condescend</b> ed to see me at my hotel.
<u>corner</u>	A free hit in field hockey taken from the corner of the field. <i>The huge bookshop on the corner</i> .
crouch	A crouching stance or posture. Leo was <b>crouch</b> ed before the fire.
elevator	The airfoil on the tailplane of an aircraft that makes it ascend or descend. In the harbour a giant <b>elevator</b> stores prairie grain.
ellipticity	The condition of being elliptic.
escalator	A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt.
<u>fold</u>	Become folded or folded up. <i>The deckchair <b>fold</b>s flat.</i>
gangling	Tall and thin. A <b>gangling</b> youth with a trace of down on his cheeks.
hypotenuse	The longest side of a right-angled triangle, opposite the right angle.



incline	An inclined surface or plane a slope especially on a road or railway. <i>He was <b>incline</b>d to accept the offer.</i>
landing	A place where people and goods can be landed from a boat. <i>He ran across the <b>landing</b> to his bedroom.</i>
obliquity	The quality of being deceptive.
recumbent	A type of bicycle designed to be ridden lying almost flat on one's back. <i>Recumbent statues.</i>
refraction	The change in direction of a propagating wave (light or sound) when passing from one medium to another.
<u>skew</u>	Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew crooked. The lines on the sheet of paper are <b>skew</b> ed.
<u>slant</u>	Present or view (information) from a particular angle, especially in a biased or unfair way. <i>The hedge grew at a slant</i> .
staircase	A set of stairs and its surrounding walls or structure. <i>He descended the broad <b>staircase</b>.</i>
stoop	Sag, bend, bend over or down. I won t <b>stoop</b> to reading other people s mail.
swerve	Turn sharply; change direction abruptly. Do not make sudden <b>swerve</b> s particularly around parked vehicles.
<u>tend</u>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. She <b>tend</b> s to the children.
theta	The 8th letter of the Greek alphabet. <i>Theta Draconis</i> .
tilt	Charge with a tilt. The paper s <b>tilt</b> towards the United States.
wizened	Lean and wrinkled by shrinkage as from age or illness. A <b>wizened</b> little man with frizzy grey hair.
yaw	Deviate erratically from a set course. The ship <b>yaw</b> ed when the huge waves hit it.
