## Associations of "Leaned" (30 Words)

<a href="#">angle</a>	Move or be inclined at an angle. <i>He always had a fresh <b>angle</b> on life.</i>
<b>axis</b>	A fixed reference line for the measurement of coordinates. <i>The leaflets are arranged in rows on a slender <b>axis</b>.</i>
<b>banister</b>	The structure formed by the uprights and handrail at the side of a staircase. <i>She peered over the <b>banisters</b>.</i>
<b>bend</b>	A kind of knot used to join two ropes together or to tie a rope to another object e.g a carrick bend. <i>The van screeched round a <b>bend</b>.</i>
<b>bending</b>	The act of bending something.
<a href="#">bow</a>	Play on a string instrument with a bow. <i>A girl with long hair tied back in a <b>bow</b>.</i>
<b>condescend</b>	Treat condescendingly. <i>He <b>condescended</b> to see me at my hotel.</i>
<a href="#">corner</a>	A free hit in field hockey taken from the corner of the field. <i>The huge bookshop on the <b>corner</b>.</i>
<b>crouch</b>	A crouching stance or posture. <i>Leo was <b>crouched</b> before the fire.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	The airfoil on the tailplane of an aircraft that makes it ascend or descend. <i>In the harbour a giant <b>elevator</b> stores prairie grain.</i>
<b>ellipticity</b>	The condition of being elliptic.
<b>escalator</b>	A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt.
<a href="#">fold</a>	Become folded or folded up. <i>The deckchair <b>folds</b> flat.</i>
<b>gangling</b>	Tall and thin. <i>A <b>gangling</b> youth with a trace of down on his cheeks.</i>
<b>hypotenuse</b>	The longest side of a right-angled triangle, opposite the right angle.

<b>incline</b>	An inclined surface or plane a slope especially on a road or railway. <i>He was <b>inclined</b> to accept the offer.</i>
<b>landing</b>	A place where people and goods can be landed from a boat. <i>He ran across the <b>landing</b> to his bedroom.</i>
<b>obliquity</b>	The quality of being deceptive.
<b>recumbent</b>	A type of bicycle designed to be ridden lying almost flat on one's back. <i><b>Recumbent</b> statues.</i>
<b>refraction</b>	The change in direction of a propagating wave (light or sound) when passing from one medium to another.
<b>skew</b>	Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew crooked. <i>The lines on the sheet of paper are <b>skewed</b>.</i>
<b>slant</b>	Present or view (information) from a particular angle, especially in a biased or unfair way. <i>The hedge grew at a <b>slant</b>.</i>
<b>staircase</b>	A set of stairs and its surrounding walls or structure. <i>He descended the broad <b>staircase</b>.</i>
<b>stoop</b>	Sag, bend, bend over or down. <i>I won't <b>stoop</b> to reading other people's mail.</i>
<b>swerve</b>	Turn sharply; change direction abruptly. <i>Do not make sudden <b>swerves</b> particularly around parked vehicles.</i>
<b>tend</b>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>She <b>tends</b> to the children.</i>
<b>theta</b>	The 8th letter of the Greek alphabet. <i><b>Theta</b> Draconis.</i>
<b>tilt</b>	Charge with a tilt. <i>The paper's <b>tilt</b> towards the United States.</i>
<b>wizened</b>	Lean and wrinkled by shrinkage as from age or illness. <i>A <b>wizened</b> little man with frizzy grey hair.</i>
<b>yaw</b>	Deviate erratically from a set course. <i>The ship <b>yawed</b> when the huge waves hit it.</i>
