Associations of "Leaned" (30 Words)

angle	Move or be inclined at an angle. <i>He always had a fresh angle on life.</i>
axis	A fixed reference line for the measurement of coordinates. <i>The leaflets are arranged in rows on a slender axis.</i>
banister	The structure formed by the uprights and handrail at the side of a staircase. <i>She peered over the banisters.</i>
bend	A kind of knot used to join two ropes together or to tie a rope to another object e.g a carrick bend. <i>The van screeched round a bend.</i>
bending	The act of bending something.
bow	Play on a string instrument with a bow. <i>A girl with long hair tied back in a bow.</i>
condescend	Treat condescendingly. <i>He condescended to see me at my hotel.</i>
corner	A free hit in field hockey taken from the corner of the field. <i>The huge bookshop on the corner.</i>
crouch	A crouching stance or posture. <i>Leo was crouched before the fire.</i>
elevator	The airfoil on the tailplane of an aircraft that makes it ascend or descend. <i>In the harbour a giant elevator stores prairie grain.</i>
ellipticity	The condition of being elliptic.
escalator	A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt.
fold	Become folded or folded up. <i>The deckchair folds flat.</i>
gangling	Tall and thin. <i>A gangling youth with a trace of down on his cheeks.</i>
hypotenuse	The longest side of a right-angled triangle, opposite the right angle.

incline	An inclined surface or plane a slope especially on a road or railway. <i>He was inclined to accept the offer.</i>
landing	A place where people and goods can be landed from a boat. <i>He ran across the landing to his bedroom.</i>
obliquity	The quality of being deceptive.
recumbent	A type of bicycle designed to be ridden lying almost flat on one's back. <i>Recumbent statues.</i>
refraction	The change in direction of a propagating wave (light or sound) when passing from one medium to another.
skew	Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew crooked. <i>The lines on the sheet of paper are skewed.</i>
slant	Present or view (information) from a particular angle, especially in a biased or unfair way. <i>The hedge grew at a slant.</i>
staircase	A set of stairs and its surrounding walls or structure. <i>He descended the broad staircase.</i>
stoop	Sag, bend, bend over or down. <i>I won't stoop to reading other people's mail.</i>
swerve	Turn sharply; change direction abruptly. <i>Do not make sudden swerves particularly around parked vehicles.</i>
tend	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>She tends to the children.</i>
theta	The 8th letter of the Greek alphabet. <i>Theta Draconis.</i>
tilt	Charge with a tilt. <i>The paper's tilt towards the United States.</i>
wizened	Lean and wrinkled by shrinkage as from age or illness. <i>A wizened little man with frizzy grey hair.</i>
yaw	Deviate erratically from a set course. <i>The ship yawed when the huge waves hit it.</i>
