## Associations of "Leant" (30 Words)

<a href="#">angle</a>	Direct or incline at an angle. <i>From this <b>angle</b> Maggie could not see Naomi s face.</i>
<b>axis</b>	The alliance of Germany and Italy formed before and during the Second World War, later extended to include Japan and other countries. <i>The Anglo American <b>axis</b>.</i>
<b>banister</b>	The structure formed by the uprights and handrail at the side of a staircase. <i>She peered over the <b>banisters</b>.</i>
<b>bend</b>	Bend a joint. <i>The road <b>bends</b>.</i>
<b>bending</b>	The act of bending something.
<a href="#">bow</a>	Play on a string instrument with a bow. <i>He pointed the <b>bow</b> of the boat toward the finish line.</i>
<b>condescend</b>	Treat condescendingly. <i>Take care not to <b>condescend</b> to your reader.</i>
<a href="#">corner</a>	Solid exterior angle of a building especially one formed by a cornerstone. <i><b>Corner</b> the gold market.</i>
<b>crouch</b>	A crouching stance or posture. <i>Leo was <b>crouched</b> before the fire.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. <i>In the harbour a giant <b>elevator</b> stores prairie grain.</i>
<b>ellipticity</b>	The degree of deviation from circularity (or sphericity).
<b>escalator</b>	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
<a href="#">fold</a>	Be able to be opened out unfold. <i><b>Fold</b> up the newspaper.</i>
<b>gangling</b>	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs. <i>A <b>gangling</b> teenager.</i>

<b>hypotenuse</b>	The side of a right triangle opposite the right angle.
<b>incline</b>	An inclined surface connecting two levels. <i>He <b>inclined</b> his ear to the wise old man.</i>
<b>landing</b>	The act of coming down to the earth (or other surface). <i>The plane made a smooth <b>landing</b>.</i>
<b>obliquity</b>	The quality of being deceptive.
<b>recumbent</b>	(of a plant) growing close to the ground. <i><b>Recumbent</b> shrubs.</i>
<b>refraction</b>	The fact or phenomenon of light, radio waves, etc. being deflected in passing obliquely through the interface between one medium and another or through a medium of varying density.
<b>skew</b>	Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew crooked. <i>The picture was <b>skew</b>.</i>
<b>slant</b>	A sloping position. <i>Democrats argued that the station's coverage was <b>slanted</b> towards Republicans.</i>
<b>staircase</b>	A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>A mirrored <b>staircase</b>.</i>
<b>stoop</b>	Bend one's head or body forwards and downwards. <i>The eagle <b>stooped</b> on the mice in the field.</i>
<b>swerve</b>	An erratic deflection from an intended course. <i>Do not make sudden <b>swerves</b> particularly around parked vehicles.</i>
<b>tend</b>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>The orbit <b>tends</b> to infinity.</i>
<b>theta</b>	The eighth star in a constellation. <i><b>Theta</b> Draconis.</i>
<b>tilt</b>	A combat between two mounted knights tilting against each other with blunted lances. <i>The floor <b>tilted</b> slightly.</i>
<b>wizened</b>	Lean and wrinkled by shrinkage as from age or illness-W.F.Starkie. <i>A <b>wizened</b> weather beaten old man.</i>
<b>yaw</b>	Swerve off course momentarily. <i>The ship <b>yawed</b> when the huge waves hit it.</i>
