Associations of "Leant" (30 Words)

angle	Direct or incline at an angle. <i>From this angle Maggie could not see Naomi s face.</i>
axis	The alliance of Germany and Italy formed before and during the Second World War, later extended to include Japan and other countries. <i>The Anglo American axis.</i>
banister	The structure formed by the uprights and handrail at the side of a staircase. <i>She peered over the banisters.</i>
bend	Bend a joint. <i>The road bends.</i>
bending	The act of bending something.
bow	Play on a string instrument with a bow. <i>He pointed the bow of the boat toward the finish line.</i>
condescend	Treat condescendingly. <i>Take care not to condescend to your reader.</i>
corner	Solid exterior angle of a building especially one formed by a cornerstone. <i>Corner the gold market.</i>
crouch	A crouching stance or posture. <i>Leo was crouched before the fire.</i>
elevator	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. <i>In the harbour a giant elevator stores prairie grain.</i>
ellipticity	The degree of deviation from circularity (or sphericity).
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
fold	Be able to be opened out unfold. <i>Fold up the newspaper.</i>
gangling	Tall and thin and having long slender limbs. <i>A gangling teenager.</i>

hypotenuse	The side of a right triangle opposite the right angle.
incline	An inclined surface connecting two levels. <i>He inclined his ear to the wise old man.</i>
landing	The act of coming down to the earth (or other surface). <i>The plane made a smooth landing.</i>
obliquity	The quality of being deceptive.
recumbent	(of a plant) growing close to the ground. <i>Recumbent shrubs.</i>
refraction	The fact or phenomenon of light, radio waves, etc. being deflected in passing obliquely through the interface between one medium and another or through a medium of varying density.
skew	Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line askew crooked. <i>The picture was skew.</i>
slant	A sloping position. <i>Democrats argued that the station's coverage was slanted towards Republicans.</i>
staircase	A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>A mirrored staircase.</i>
stoop	Bend one's head or body forwards and downwards. <i>The eagle stooped on the mice in the field.</i>
swerve	An erratic deflection from an intended course. <i>Do not make sudden swerves particularly around parked vehicles.</i>
tend	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>The orbit tends to infinity.</i>
theta	The eighth star in a constellation. <i>Theta Draconis.</i>
tilt	A combat between two mounted knights tilting against each other with blunted lances. <i>The floor tilted slightly.</i>
wizened	Lean and wrinkled by shrinkage as from age or illness-W.F.Starkie. <i>A wizened weather beaten old man.</i>
yaw	Swerve off course momentarily. <i>The ship yawed when the huge waves hit it.</i>
