- *A person who is learning to drive a motor vehicle and has not yet passed a driving test.*
- *A person who is learning a subject or skill.*
- *Works for an expert to learn a trade.*

- fledgling** A person or organization that is immature, inexperienced, or underdeveloped.  
*The country's **fledgling** democracy.*
- fresher** A first-year undergraduate.  
*Both older members of the university and **freshers** are vulnerable.*
- freshman** A first-year student at university.  
*We invited the **freshmen**.*
- freshwoman** A female first-year student.

<b>initiate</b>	A person who has been initiated into an organization or activity. <i>It is very familiar to the <b>initiate</b>.</i>
<b>mentee</b>	A person who is advised, trained, or counselled by a mentor.
<b>neophyte</b>	A new convert being taught the principles of Christianity by a catechist. <i>A cast of <b>neophyte</b> actors.</i>
<b>newcomer</b>	A person who has recently arrived in a place. <i>He s a <b>newcomer</b> to Boston.</i>
<b>novice</b>	An animal, especially a racehorse, that has not yet won a major prize or reached a sufficient level of performance to qualify for important events. <i>He was a complete <b>novice</b> in foreign affairs.</i>
<b>prentice</b>	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>A tailor s <b>prentice</b>.</i>
<b>probationer</b>	A nurse in training who is undergoing a trial period.
<b>pupil</b>	A trainee barrister. <i>They are former <b>pupils</b> of the school.</i>
<b>raw recruit</b>	Informal terms for nakedness.
<b>scholar</b>	A university student holding a scholarship. <i>A Hebrew <b>scholar</b>.</i>
<b>starter</b>	The official who signals the beginning of a race or competition. <i>Material to act as a <b>starter</b> for discussion.</i>
<b>student</b>	A person who is studying at a university or other place of higher education. <i>High school <b>students</b>.</i>
<b>trainee</b>	Someone who is being trained. <i><b>Trainee</b> solicitors.</i>
<b>tyro</b>	Someone new to a field or activity.

## Associations of "Learner" (30 Words)

<b>amateur</b>	A person who is incompetent or inept at a particular activity. <i>An <b>amateur</b> painter.</i>
<b>apprentice</b>	Serve as an apprentice. <i>An <b>apprentice</b> barman.</i>

<b><u>beginner</u></b>	A person just starting to learn a skill or take part in an activity. <i>A <b>beginner</b> s guide.</i>
<b>class</b>	Arrange or order by classes or categories. <i>I took <b>classes</b> in Indian music.</i>
<b>classmate</b>	An acquaintance that you go to school with.
<b>education</b>	The United States federal department that administers all federal programs dealing with education including federal aid to educational institutions and students created 1979. <i>A girl s <b>education</b> was less important than a boy s.</i>
<b>entrant</b>	A person or group that enters or takes part in something. <i>A well publicized <b>entrant</b> is the pocket computer.</i>
<b><u>fledgling</u></b>	Young and inexperienced. <i>A <b>fledgling</b> enterprise.</i>
<b>freshman</b>	A first-year student at university. <i><b>Freshman</b> year in high school or college.</i>
<b>grader</b>	A pupil of a specified grade in a school. <i>A first <b>grader</b>.</i>
<b><u>graduate</u></b>	A graduated cup tube flask or measuring glass used especially by chemists and pharmacists. <i><b>Graduate</b> courses.</i>
<b>instructor</b>	A person whose occupation is teaching. <i>A driving <b>instructor</b>.</i>
<b>laity</b>	Lay people, as distinct from the clergy.
<b>layman</b>	A person without professional or specialized knowledge in a particular subject. <i>He was an active Catholic <b>layman</b>.</i>
<b><u>neophyte</u></b>	A plant that is found in an area where it had not been recorded previously. <i>Four day cooking classes are offered to <b>neophytes</b> and experts.</i>
<b>newbie</b>	Any new participant in some activity.
<b><u>newcomer</u></b>	A person who has recently arrived in a place. <i>She s a <b>newcomer</b> to the area.</i>
<b>novice</b>	A person new to and inexperienced in a job or situation. <i>He was a complete <b>novice</b> in foreign affairs.</i>
<b>prentice</b>	Works for an expert to learn a trade. <i>A tailor s <b>prentice</b>.</i>

<b>pupil</b>	A person who is taught by another, especially a schoolchild or student in relation to a teacher. <i>Will you take me on as your <b>pupil</b>.</i>
<b>rookie</b>	An awkward and inexperienced youth. <i>A <b>rookie</b> cop.</i>
<b>sophomore</b>	A second-year undergraduate. <i>His <b>sophomore</b> year.</i>
<b>starter</b>	A plan or idea that has a chance of succeeding and is therefore worthy of consideration. <i>Material to act as a <b>starter</b> for discussion.</i>
<b>student</b>	Denoting someone who is studying in order to enter a particular profession. <i>A <b>student</b> of the free market.</i>
<b>teaching</b>	The occupation, profession, or work of a teacher. <i>I went into <b>teaching</b> because I like working with children.</i>
<b>trainee</b>	Someone who is being trained. <i><b>Trainee</b> solicitors.</i>
<b>training</b>	The action of teaching a person or animal a particular skill or type of behaviour. <i>You ll have to go into strict <b>training</b>.</i>
<b>tutorial</b>	Of or relating to tutors or tutoring. <i>A <b>tutorial</b> on English poetry.</i>
<b>tyro</b>	Someone new to a field or activity.
<b>undergraduate</b>	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i><b>Undergraduate</b> students.</i>
