- comfortable** Providing or experiencing physical well-being or relief ('comfy' is informal).  
*The Rector enjoyed a **comfortable** lifestyle with plenty of servants.*
- easy** Free from worry or anxiety.  
*An **easy** victim.*
- easygoing** Not burdensome or demanding; borne or done easily and without hardship.  
*An **easygoing** teacher who allowed extra time for assignments.*
- effortless** Not showing effort or strain.  
*Each skill is practised to the point that it becomes **effortless**.*
- gentle** Having little impact.  
*A **gentle** reprimand.*
- lackadaisical** Lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy.  
*A **lackadaisical** attempt.*
- languid** Weak or faint from illness or fatigue.  
*A **languid** mood.*

<b>languorous</b>	Lacking spirit or liveliness. <i>Summer has a slow <b>languorous</b> feel to it here.</i>
<b>lazy</b>	Disinclined to work or exertion. <i>At a <b>lazy</b> pace.</i>
<b>lingering</b>	Lasting for a long time or slow to end. <i>There are still some <b>lingering</b> doubts in my mind.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	Free from tension and anxiety. <i>A <b>relaxed</b> and informal discussion.</i>
<b>restful</b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>She spent a <b>restful</b> night at home.</i>
<b>sedate</b>	Quiet and rather dull. <i><b>Sedate</b> suburban domesticity.</i>
<b>slow</b>	Slow to learn or understand lacking intellectual acuity Thackeray. <i>He was <b>slow</b> in reacting to the news.</i>
<b>undemanding</b>	(especially of a task) not demanding. <i>An <b>undemanding</b> boss.</i>
<b>unhurried</b>	Relaxed and leisurely; without hurry or haste. <i>People strolling about in an <b>unhurried</b> way.</i>
<b>unrushed</b>	Characterized by an absence of haste; unhurried. <i>He seemed to have a controlled <b>unrushed</b> way of moving.</i>

- *At a leisurely (or easygoing) pace.*

- *Without hurry.*



## Synonyms of "Leisurely" as an adverb (2 Words)

**in one's own good time** To or toward the inside of.

**steadily**

At a steady rate or pace.

*The business has been growing **steadily**.*

- carefree** Free of trouble and worry and care.  
***Carefree** millionaires untroubled financially.*
- casual** A youth belonging to a subculture characterized by the wearing of expensive casual clothing and frequently associated with football hooliganism.  
*A **casual** remark.*
- drawl** A slow speech pattern with prolonged vowels.  
***Drawl** one s vowels.*
- easy** With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily.  
*An **easy** victory.*



<b>easygoing</b>	Relaxed and informal in attitude or standards. <i>The <b>easygoing</b> life of a parttime consultant.</i>
<b>erode</b>	(of a disease) gradually destroy (bodily tissue). <i>Many had their upper incisors missing and their maxillae <b>eroded</b>.</i>
<b>facile</b>	Arrived at without due care or effort; lacking depth. <i><b>Facile</b> generalizations.</i>
<b>gradually</b>	In a gradual manner. <i>The snake moved <b>gradually</b> toward its victim.</i>
<b>halcyon</b>	A tropical Asian and African kingfisher with brightly coloured plumage. <i>A <b>halcyon</b> atmosphere.</i>
<b>happy-go-lucky</b>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
<b>idler</b>	Person who does no work.
<b>indolence</b>	Avoidance of activity or exertion; laziness. <i>My failure is probably due to my own <b>indolence</b>.</i>
<b>intelligently</b>	In a knowledgeable and insightful way; cleverly. <i>Many spoke <b>intelligently</b> about the issues.</i>
<b>laconic</b>	Brief and to the point; effectively cut short. <i>His <b>laconic</b> reply suggested a lack of interest in the topic.</i>
<b>laggard</b>	A person who makes slow progress and falls behind others. <i>A bell to summon <b>laggard</b> children to school.</i>
<b>lazy</b>	(of a river) slow-moving. <i>Up a <b>lazy</b> river.</i>
<b>measured</b>	(of speech or writing) carefully considered and restrained. <i>With <b>measured</b> irony.</i>
<b>mellow</b>	Soften make mellow. <i>Jean Claude was feeling <b>mellow</b>.</i>
<b>motion</b>	An optical illusion of motion produced by viewing a rapid succession of still pictures of a moving object. <i>73 of the patients had fewer than three bowel <b>motions</b> a day.</i>
<b>plod</b>	Work slowly and perseveringly at a dull task. <i>We <b>plodded</b> back up the hill.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	Without strain or anxiety. <i>We were having a great time and feeling very <b>relaxed</b>.</i>
<b>slack</b>	Make less active or intense. <i>The veteran king of <b>slack</b> chat.</i>
<b>slacken</b>	Make less active or fast. <i>The pace never <b>slackens</b>.</i>

<b>slow</b>	Of a sports field or ground likely to make the ball bounce or run slowly or to prevent competitors from travelling fast. <i>The train went <b>slower</b> and <b>slower</b>.</i>
<b>slowly</b>	Without speed slow is sometimes used informally for slowly. <i>They moved forward <b>slowly</b>.</i>
<b>thoughtfully</b>	In a way that suggests being absorbed in thought. <i>He nodded <b>thoughtfully</b> as I finished speaking.</i>
<b>trudge</b>	Walk heavily and firmly, as when weary, or through mud. <i>I <b>trudged</b> up the stairs.</i>
<b>unhurried</b>	Relaxed and leisurely; without hurry or haste. <i>Spoke in a calm and <b>unhurried</b> voice.</i>
<b>untroubled</b>	Not beset by troubles or disturbance or distress. <i>A man <b>untroubled</b> by a guilty conscience.</i>
