comfortable	Providing or experiencing physical well-being or relief (`comfy' is informal. <i>The Rector enjoyed a comfortable lifestyle with plenty of servants.</i>
easy	Free from worry or anxiety. An easy victim.
<u>easygoing</u>	Not burdensome or demanding; borne or done easily and without hardship. <i>An easygoing</i> teacher who allowed extra time for assignments.
effortless	Not showing effort or strain. Each skill is practised to the point that it becomes effortless .
<u>gentle</u>	Having little impact. A gentle reprimand.
<u>lackadaisical</u>	Lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy. A lackadaisical attempt.
<u>languid</u>	Weak or faint from illness or fatigue. A languid mood.



languorous	Lacking spirit or liveliness. Summer has a slow languorous feel to it here.
<u>lazy</u>	Disinclined to work or exertion. At a lazy pace.
lingering	Lasting for a long time or slow to end. There are still some lingering doubts in my mind.
relaxed	Free from tension and anxiety. A relaxed and informal discussion.
<u>restful</u>	Affording physical or mental rest. She spent a restful night at home.
<u>sedate</u>	Quiet and rather dull. <i>Sedate</i> suburban domesticity.
slow	Slow to learn or understand lacking intellectual acuity Thackeray. <i>He was slow in reacting to the news.</i>
undemanding	(especially of a task) not demanding. An undemanding boss.
unhurried	Relaxed and leisurely; without hurry or haste. People strolling about in an unhurried way.
unrushed	Characterized by an absence of haste; unhurried. <i>He seemed to have a controlled</i> unrushed way of moving.

drawl	A slow speech pattern with prolonged vowels. Drawl one s vowels.
easy	With ease easy is sometimes used informally for easily. An easy victory.



<u>easygoing</u>	Relaxed and informal in attitude or standards. The easygoing life of a parttime consultant.
erode	(of a disease) gradually destroy (bodily tissue. Many had their upper incisors missing and their maxillae erode d.
<u>facile</u>	Arrived at without due care or effort; lacking depth. <i>Facile</i> generalizations.
<u>gradually</u>	In a gradual manner. The snake moved gradually toward its victim.
halcyon	A tropical Asian and African kingfisher with brightly coloured plumage. A <i>halcyon</i> atmosphere.
happy-go-lucky	Presaging or likely to bring good luck.
idler	Person who does no work.
indolence	Avoidance of activity or exertion; laziness. My failure is probably due to my own indolence .
<u>intelligently</u>	In a knowledgeable and insightful way; cleverly. Many spoke intelligently about the issues.
laconic	Brief and to the point; effectively cut short. His laconic reply suggested a lack of interest in the topic.
laggard	A person who makes slow progress and falls behind others. A bell to summon laggard children to school.
<u>lazy</u>	(of a river) slow-moving. Up a lazy river.
measured	(of speech or writing) carefully considered and restrained. With measured irony.
mellow	Soften make mellow. Jean Claude was feeling mellow .
motion	An optical illusion of motion produced by viewing a rapid succession of still pictures of a moving object. 73 of the patients had fewer than three bowel motions a day.
plod	Work slowly and perseveringly at a dull task. We plod ded back up the hill.
relaxed	Without strain or anxiety. We were having a great time and feeling very relaxed .
slack	Make less active or intense. The veteran king of slack chat.
slacken	Make less active or fast. The pace never slacken s.



slow	Of a sports field or ground likely to make the ball bounce or run slowly or to prevent competitors from travelling fast. <i>The train went slower and slower.</i>
slowly	Without speed slow is sometimes used informally for slowly. They moved forward slowly .
<u>thoughtfully</u>	In a way that suggests being absorbed in thought. He nodded thoughtfully as I finished speaking.
trudge	Walk heavily and firmly, as when weary, or through mud. I trudge d up the stairs.
unhurried	Relaxed and leisurely; without hurry or haste. Spoke in a calm and unhurried voice.
untroubled	Not beset by troubles or disturbance or distress. A man untroubled by a guilty conscience.
