## Associations of "Let alone" (30 Words)

<b>cloistered</b>	Enclosed by or having a cloister. <i>The <b>cloistered</b> academic world of books.</i>
<b>detached</b>	(of a social worker or social work) operating or based in the community rather than in an office. <i>The <b>detached</b> shutter fell on him.</i>
<b>forlorn</b>	Pitifully sad and abandoned or lonely. <i>The last <b>forlorn</b> attempt.</i>
<b>hermit</b>	One retired from society for religious reasons.
<b>homesick</b>	Experiencing a longing for one’s home during a period of absence from it. <i>He was <b>homesick</b> for America after five weeks in Europe.</i>
<b>isolate</b>	A culture of microorganisms isolated for study. <i>Social <b>isolates</b> often become careless of their own welfare.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Far away from other places, buildings, or people; remote. <i><b>Isolated</b> incidents of student unrest.</i>
<b>isolation</b>	The process or fact of isolating or being isolated. <i><b>Isolation</b> from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.</i>
<b>lone</b>	Being the only one; single and isolated from others. <i>The <b>lone</b> doctor in the entire county.</i>
<b>loneliness</b>	The state of being alone in solitary isolation. <i>Feelings of depression and <b>loneliness</b>.</i>
<b>lonely</b>	(of a place) unfrequented and remote. <i>Felt sad and <b>lonely</b>.</i>
<b>lonesome</b>	Marked by dejection from being alone. <i>A <b>lonesome</b> pine.</i>
<b>outsider</b>	A person who does not belong to a particular organization or profession. <i>He started as a rank <b>outsider</b>.</i>

<b>privacy</b>	The state of being free from public attention. <i>A law to restrict newspapers freedom to invade people s <b>privacy</b>.</i>
<b>recluse</b>	Favouring a solitary life. <i>She has turned into a virtual <b>recluse</b>.</i>
<b>remote</b>	A remote control device. <i>The theory seems rather intellectual and <b>remote</b> from everyday experience.</i>
<b>seclude</b>	Keep (someone) away from other people. <i>I <b>secluded</b> myself up here for a life of study and meditation.</i>
<b>secluded</b>	Providing privacy or seclusion. <i>A <b>secluded</b> romantic spot.</i>
<b>seclusion</b>	The act of secluding yourself from others. <i>They enjoyed ten days of peace and <b>seclusion</b>.</i>
<b>segregate</b>	Someone who is or has been segregated. <i>We don t <b>segregate</b> in this county.</i>
<b>separated</b>	Separated at the joint. <i>The <b>separated</b> spacecraft will return to their home bases.</i>
<b>sequester</b>	A general cut in government spending. <i>The estate was <b>sequestered</b>.</i>
<b>single</b>	Reduce a railway track to a single line. <i>A <b>single</b> lens.</i>
<b>sole</b>	Put a new sole on. <i>A big blister on each heel and <b>sole</b>.</i>
<b>solitary</b>	(of a flower or other part) borne singly. <i>He had something of the <b>solitary</b> about him.</i>
<b>solitude</b>	A lonely or uninhabited place. <i>She savoured her few hours of freedom and <b>solitude</b>.</i>
<b>troglodyte</b>	Someone who lives in a cave. Not likely to be rewarded.
<b>unappreciated</b>	<i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt <b>unappreciated</b> and undervalued.</i>
<b>unrewarding</b>	Not rewarding; not providing personal satisfaction. <i>It was dull <b>unrewarding</b> work.</i>
<b>unsung</b>	Not celebrated or praised. <i><b>Unsung</b> heroes of the war.</i>
