
# Lethargic as an Adjective

**groggy** exhaustion.

The sleeping pills had left her feeling **groggy**.

Lacking enthusiasm and determination; carelessly lazy.

lackadaisical A lackadaisical attempt.

(of a person, manner, or gesture) having or showing a disinclination for

**languid** physical exertion or effort.

A **languid** wave of the hand.

languor An oppressive stillness of the air.

Her whole being was pervaded by a dreamy **languor**.

languorous Characterized by tiredness or inactivity, especially of a pleasurable kind.

A hot **languorous** afternoon.

lazy (of a brand on livestock) placed on its side rather than upright.
