even	Being level or straight or regular and without variation as e g in shape or texture or being in the same plane or at the same height as something else i e even with. <i>Headers can be placed on odd or even pages or both.</i>
grade	Assign a grade or rank to according to one s evaluation. <i>A moderate grade of intelligence.</i>
halfway	At a point midway between two extremes. <i>He stopped halfway down the passage.</i>
homogenization	A process by which the fat droplets from milk are emulsified and the cream does not separate. <i>The fear of cultural homogenization is a barrier to some multinational businesses.</i>
interim	An interim dividend profit etc. <i>In the interim I ll just keep my fingers crossed.</i>

intermediate	An intermediate thing. <i>Intermediate capacity.</i>
middlebrow	A middlebrow person. <i>Middlebrow fiction.</i>
midway	At half the distance; at the middle. <i>He sensationally led the tournament at the midway point.</i>
palimpsest	Something reused or altered but still bearing visible traces of its earlier form. <i>Sutton Place is a palimpsest of the taste of successive owners.</i>
patter	A repeated light tapping. <i>Gently pattering rain.</i>
pentavalent	Having a valence of five.
phase	Each of the electrical windings or connections of a polyphase machine or circuit. <i>The draw for the qualifying phase of the tournament was held over the weekend.</i>
procedure	A particular course of action intended to achieve a result. <i>The procedure is carried out under general anaesthetic.</i>
progression	A number of things in a series. <i>The vista unfolds in a progression of castles and vineyards as seemingly endless as the Rhine itself.</i>
protocol	A procedure for carrying out a scientific experiment or a course of medical treatment. <i>A study protocol approved by the ethics committee of the hospital.</i>
qualification	The qualification stage of a sporting event. <i>The five year residency qualification for presidential candidates.</i>
sere	Having lost all moisture. <i>The desert was edged with sere vegetation.</i>
step	Furnish with steps. <i>Please step this way.</i>
stipulation	A restriction that is insisted upon as a condition for an agreement. <i>A stipulation of fact was made in order to avoid delay.</i>
stratified	(of seeds) placed close together in layers in moist sand or peat to preserve them or to help them germinate. <i>Warming temperatures can lead to more stratified ocean layers.</i>
symmetry	(physics) the property of being isotropic; having the same value when measured in different directions. <i>The political symmetry between the two debates.</i>

term	Give a descriptive name to call by a specified term. <i>He could only be dealt with on his own terms.</i>
<u>tier</u>	A relative position or degree of value in a graded group. <i>A three tier wedding cake.</i>
transitional	Of or denoting the last stage of Romanesque style, in which Gothic elements begin to appear. <i>A transitional government was appointed.</i>
