<b>denotation</b>	The literal or primary meaning of a word, in contrast to the feelings or ideas that the word suggests. <i>Beyond their immediate <b>denotation</b> the words have a connotative power.</i>
<b>even</b>	Being level or straight or regular and without variation as e g in shape or texture or being in the same plane or at the same height as something else i e even with. <i>Headers can be placed on odd or <b>even</b> pages or both.</i>
<b>grade</b>	Assign a grade or rank to according to one s evaluation. <i>A moderate <b>grade</b> of intelligence.</i>
<b>halfway</b>	At a point midway between two extremes. <i>He stopped <b>halfway</b> down the passage.</i>
<b>homogenization</b>	A process by which the fat droplets from milk are emulsified and the cream does not separate. <i>The fear of cultural <b>homogenization</b> is a barrier to some multinational businesses.</i>
<b>interim</b>	An interim dividend profit etc. <i>In the <b>interim</b> I ll just keep my fingers crossed.</i>

<b>intermediate</b>	An intermediate thing. <i><b>Intermediate</b> capacity.</i>
<b>middlebrow</b>	A middlebrow person. <i><b>Middlebrow</b> fiction.</i>
<b>midway</b>	At half the distance; at the middle. <i>He sensationally led the tournament at the <b>midway</b> point.</i>
<b>palimpsest</b>	Something reused or altered but still bearing visible traces of its earlier form. <i>Sutton Place is a <b>palimpsest</b> of the taste of successive owners.</i>
<b>patter</b>	A repeated light tapping. <i>Gently <b>pattering</b> rain.</i>
<b>pentavalent</b>	Having a valence of five.
<b>phase</b>	Each of the electrical windings or connections of a polyphase machine or circuit. <i>The draw for the qualifying <b>phase</b> of the tournament was held over the weekend.</i>
<b>procedure</b>	A particular course of action intended to achieve a result. <i>The <b>procedure</b> is carried out under general anaesthetic.</i>
<b>progression</b>	A number of things in a series. <i>The vista unfolds in a <b>progression</b> of castles and vineyards as seemingly endless as the Rhine itself.</i>
<b>protocol</b>	A procedure for carrying out a scientific experiment or a course of medical treatment. <i>A study <b>protocol</b> approved by the ethics committee of the hospital.</i>
<b>qualification</b>	The qualification stage of a sporting event. <i>The five year residency <b>qualification</b> for presidential candidates.</i>
<b>sere</b>	Having lost all moisture. <i>The desert was edged with <b>sere</b> vegetation.</i>
<b>step</b>	Furnish with steps. <i>Please <b>step</b> this way.</i>
<b>stipulation</b>	A restriction that is insisted upon as a condition for an agreement. <i>A <b>stipulation</b> of fact was made in order to avoid delay.</i>
<b>stratified</b>	(of seeds) placed close together in layers in moist sand or peat to preserve them or to help them germinate. <i>Warming temperatures can lead to more <b>stratified</b> ocean layers.</i>
<b>symmetry</b>	(physics) the property of being isotropic; having the same value when measured in different directions. <i>The political <b>symmetry</b> between the two debates.</i>

<b>term</b>	Give a descriptive name to call by a specified term. <i>He could only be dealt with on his own <b>terms</b>.</i>
<b><u>tier</u></b>	A relative position or degree of value in a graded group. <i>A three <b>tier</b> wedding cake.</i>
<b>transitional</b>	Of or denoting the last stage of Romanesque style, in which Gothic elements begin to appear. <i>A <b>transitional</b> government was appointed.</i>
