balance	A weight that balances another weight. <i>The balance of the voices is good.</i>
climacteric	Of a fruit undergoing a climacteric. <i>Most women do not experience significant psychological problems at the climacteric.</i>
designed	Done or made or performed with purpose and intent- Havelock Ellis. <i>Specially designed buildings.</i>
dispassionate	Not influenced by strong emotion, and so able to be rational and impartial. <i>A journalist should be a dispassionate reporter of fact.</i>
equilibrium	A situation in which supply and demand are matched and prices stable. <i>The equilibrium level of income.</i>
equipoise	Balance or counterbalance (something). <i>Capital flows act as an equipoise to international imbalances in savings.</i>
even	Make even or more even. <i>An even fight.</i>
halfway	At half the distance; at the middle. <i>I m incapable of doing anything even halfway decent.</i>
homogenization	The process of making things uniform or similar. <i>The homogenization of cream.</i>
identification	The act of designating or identifying something. <i>Do you have any identification.</i>
impartial	Free from undue bias or preconceived opinions. <i>The minister cannot be impartial in the way that a judge would be.</i>
impartiality	Equal treatment of all rivals or disputants; fairness. <i>Entries had to be submitted under a pseudonym to ensure impartiality in the judging process.</i>

interim	An interim dividend profit etc. <i>In the interim I'll just keep my fingers crossed.</i>
intermediate	An intermediate thing. <i>An intermediate range plane.</i>
middlebrow	A middlebrow person. <i>Middlebrow fiction.</i>
midway	The place at a fair or carnival where sideshows and similar amusements are located. <i>He sensationally led the tournament at the midway point.</i>
minded	Mentally oriented toward something specified. <i>Civic minded.</i>
neutrality	The state of not supporting or helping either side in a conflict, disagreement, etc.; impartiality. <i>During the war Switzerland maintained its neutrality.</i>
oriented	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The house had its large windows oriented toward the ocean view.</i>
patter	A quick succession of light rapid sounds. <i>He quickly pattered down the stairs.</i>
pentavalent	Having a valence of five.
phase	Physical chemistry a distinct state of matter in a system matter that is identical in chemical composition and physical state and separated from other material by the phase boundary. <i>The draw for the qualifying phase of the tournament was held over the weekend.</i>
procedure	A surgical operation. <i>The procedure is carried out under general anaesthetic.</i>
progression	A number of things in a series. <i>A blues progression.</i>
proscenium	The part of a modern theater stage between the curtain and the orchestra (i.e., in front of the curtain).
qualification	The qualification stage of a sporting event. <i>I left school at 15 with no qualifications.</i>
step	Place a ship's mast in its step. <i>She stepped into a life of luxury.</i>
symmetry	(mathematics) an attribute of a shape or relation; exact reflection of form on opposite sides of a dividing line or plane. <i>A crystal structure with hexagonal symmetry.</i>

Having tonality i.e. tones and chords organized in relation to one tone such as a keynote or tonic.

unsettle

Disturb the composure of.
