bookkeeper	A person whose job is to keep records of the financial affairs of a business. <i>The business had grown enough to justify hiring a bookkeeper.</i>
caretaker	An official who performs the duties of an office temporarily. <i>The club s caretaker manager.</i>
commissioner	The head of the Metropolitan Police in London. <i>A baseball commissioner.</i>
congregate	Come together, usually for a purpose. <i>The crowds congregated in front of the Vatican on Christmas Eve.</i>
corroborate	Confirm or give support to (a statement, theory, or finding). <i>The witness had corroborated the boy s account of the attack.</i>
curator	A keeper or custodian of a museum or other collection. <i>The curator of drawings at the National Gallery.</i>
custodian	A goalkeeper or wicketkeeper. <i>The custodians of pension and insurance funds.</i>
demonstrate	Provide evidence for; stand as proof of; show by one's behavior, attitude, or external attributes. <i>Their shameful silence demonstrates their ineptitude.</i>
depository	A facility where things can be deposited for storage or safekeeping. <i>Irish libraries became depositories for material from all over the world.</i>
document	Support or accompany with documentation. <i>The parents documented every step of their child s development.</i>
espouse	Take up the cause, ideology, practice, method, of someone and use it as one's own. <i>She was secretly espoused to his son Peter.</i>
exhibition	A display of a quality or emotion. <i>An exhibition match.</i>
file	File a formal charge against. <i>File a complaint.</i>
gallery	Spectators at a golf or tennis match. <i>An art gallery.</i>
genealogist	A person who traces or studies lines of family descent. <i>According to a genealogist she is the queen s 18th cousin.</i>

<u>historian</u>	An expert in or student of history, especially that of a particular period, geographical region, or social phenomenon. <i>A military historian.</i>
<u>janitor</u>	A person employed to look after a building; a caretaker.
<u>museum</u>	A depository for collecting and displaying objects having scientific or historical or artistic value. <i>The museum is noted for its fine fossil collection.</i>
repository	A central location in which data is stored and managed. <i>The metadata will be aggregated in a repository.</i>
steward	An official appointed to supervise arrangements or keep order at a large public event, for example a race, match, or demonstration. <i>The event was organized and stewarded properly.</i>
<u>substantiate</u>	Solidify, firm, or strengthen. <i>They had found nothing to substantiate the allegations.</i>
supporter	Someone who supports or champions something. <i>Labour supporters.</i>
verify	Confirm the truth of. <i>Please verify that the doors are closed.</i>
