commissioner	The head of the Metropolitan Police in London. A baseball commissioner .
congregate	Come together, usually for a purpose. The crowds congregated in front of the Vatican on Christmas Eve.
corroborate	Confirm or give support to (a statement, theory, or finding). The witness had corroborated the boy s account of the attack.
curator	A keeper or custodian of a museum or other collection. The curator of drawings at the National Gallery.
custodian	A goalkeeper or wicketkeeper. The custodians of pension and insurance funds.
demonstrate	Provide evidence for; stand as proof of; show by one's behavior, attitude, or external attributes. Their shameful silence demonstrates their ineptitude.
depository	A facility where things can be deposited for storage or safekeeping. Irish libraries became depositories for material from all over the world.
document	Support or accompany with documentation. The parents documented every step of their child s development.
espouse	Take up the cause, ideology, practice, method, of someone and use it as one's own. She was secretly espoused to his son Peter.
exhibition	A display of a quality or emotion. An exhibition match.
file	File a formal charge against. File a complaint.
gallery	Spectators at a golf or tennis match. An art gallery .
genealogist	A person who traces or studies lines of family descent. According to a genealogist she is the queen s 18th cousin.

<u>historian</u>	An expert in or student of history, especially that of a particular period, geographical region, or social phenomenon. <i>A military historian.</i>
<u>janitor</u>	A person employed to look after a building; a caretaker.
<u>museum</u>	A depository for collecting and displaying objects having scientific or historical or artistic value. <i>The museum is noted for its fine fossil collection.</i>
repository	A central location in which data is stored and managed. <i>The metadata will be aggregated in a repository.</i>
steward	An official appointed to supervise arrangements or keep order at a large public event, for example a race, match, or demonstration. <i>The event was organized and stewarded properly.</i>
<u>substantiate</u>	Solidify, firm, or strengthen. <i>They had found nothing to substantiate the allegations.</i>
supporter	Someone who supports or champions something. <i>Labour supporters.</i>
verify	Confirm the truth of. <i>Please verify that the doors are closed.</i>
