Definitions of "Library" as a noun

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "library" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A building or room containing collections of books, periodicals, and sometimes films and recorded music for use or borrowing by the public or the members of an institution.
- A room where books are kept.
- A room in a private house where books are kept.
- (computing) a collection of standard programs and subroutines that are stored and available for immediate use.
- A building that houses a collection of books and other materials.
- A collection of literary documents or records kept for reference or borrowing.
- A collection of films, recorded music, etc., organized systematically and kept for research or borrowing.
- A collection of standard programs and subroutines that are stored and available for immediate use.
- A collection of programs and software packages made generally available, often loaded and stored on disk for immediate use.
- A series of books or recordings issued by a company as a set.



- A collection of books and periodicals held in a library.
- A depository built to contain books and other materials for reading and study.

program library A document stating the aims and principles of a political party.


