## Library as a Noun

### Definitions of "Library" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “library” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A building or room containing collections of books, periodicals, and sometimes films and recorded music for use or borrowing by the public or the members of an institution.*
- *A room where books are kept.*
- *A room in a private house where books are kept.*
- *(computing) a collection of standard programs and subroutines that are stored and available for immediate use.*
- *A building that houses a collection of books and other materials.*
- *A collection of literary documents or records kept for reference or borrowing.*
- *A collection of films, recorded music, etc., organized systematically and kept for research or borrowing.*
- *A collection of standard programs and subroutines that are stored and available for immediate use.*
- *A collection of programs and software packages made generally available, often loaded and stored on disk for immediate use.*
- *A series of books or recordings issued by a company as a set.*

- A collection of books and periodicals held in a library.
- A depository built to contain books and other materials for reading and study.

**studio** A studio flat.

**subroutine library** A room where books are kept.

<b>archive</b>	Place or store something in an archive. <i>They were allowed to study in the <b>archives</b>.</i>
<b>archives</b>	Collection of records especially about an institution.
<b>archivist</b>	A person who maintains and is in charge of archives.
<b>assistant</b>	A person who helps in particular work. <i>A care <b>assistant</b>.</i>
<b>blackboard</b>	A large board with a smooth dark surface attached to a wall or supported on an easel and used by teachers in schools for writing on with chalk.
<b>bookshop</b>	A shop where books are sold.
<b>bookstore</b>	A shop where books are sold.

<b>enrol</b>	Recruit (someone) to perform a service. <i>All entrants will be <b>enrolled</b> on new style courses.</i>
<u>enrollment</u>	The act of enrolling.
<u>file</u>	Smooth with a file. <i>The company had <b>filed</b> for bankruptcy.</i>
<b>genealogist</b>	An expert in genealogy. <i>According to a <b>genealogist</b> she is the queen s 18th cousin.</i>
<b>gymnasium</b>	A room or building equipped for gymnastics, games, and other physical exercise.
<u>historian</u>	A person who is an authority on history and who studies it and writes about it. <i>A military <b>historian</b>.</i>
<u>librarian</u>	A person in charge of or assisting in a library.
<u>museum</u>	A building in which objects of historical, scientific, artistic, or cultural interest are stored and exhibited. <i>It is difficult to avoid the feeling that the city is now a living <b>museum</b>.</i>
<b>newsstand</b>	A stall where newspapers and other periodicals are sold.
<u>preserve</u>	Fruit preserved by cooking with sugar. <i>Home made <b>preserves</b>.</i>
<b>record</b>	Make a record of set down in permanent form. <i>There is no <b>record</b> of his having graduated.</i>
<b>repository</b>	A place where something, especially a natural resource, is found in significant quantities. <i>A deep <b>repository</b> for nuclear waste.</i>
<b>safekeeping</b>	Preservation in a safe place. <i>She d put her wedding ring in her purse for <b>safekeeping</b>.</i>
<u>school</u>	Send to school educate. <i>If you have <b>schooled</b> your horse properly your riding will look better.</i>

A big budget contract with a major **studio**.

**taxidermy**

The art of mounting the skins of animals so that they have lifelike appearance.

**transcription**

(genetics) the organic process whereby the DNA sequence in a gene is copied into mRNA; the process whereby a base sequence of messenger RNA is synthesized on a template of complementary DNA.

Our usual **transcription** is given in brackets.

**university**

The body of faculty and students at a university.
