existence	Everything that exists anywhere. <i>The organization has been in existence for fifteen years.</i>

functioning period	A formal or official social gathering or ceremony.
life	A sentence of imprisonment for life. <i>He could no longer cope with the complexities of life.</i>
life expectancy	Living things collectively.
life-time	The period during which something is functional (as between birth and death.

one's career	The general progression of your working or professional life.
one's threescore years and ten	A period of time containing 365 (or 366) days.
one's time	A person's experience on a particular occasion.
period of effectiveness	A punctuation mark (.) placed at the end of a declarative sentence to indicate a full stop or after abbreviations.
period of efficacy	The monthly discharge of blood from the uterus of nonpregnant women from puberty to menopause-Hippocrates.
period of usefulness	The end or completion of something.
period of validity	The monthly discharge of blood from the uterus of nonpregnant women from puberty to menopause-Hippocrates.
this mortal coil	A human being.
time on earth	A suitable moment.

anthropomorphous	Suggesting human characteristics for animals or inanimate things.
being	Being alive living. <i>A rational being.</i>
carnal	Marked by the appetites and passions of the body. <i>Carnal knowledge.</i>
complete	Complete a pass. <i>No woman s wardrobe is complete without this pretty top.</i>
denizen	A person, animal, or plant that lives or is found in a particular place. <i>Denizens of the deep.</i>

entire	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged. <i>My plans are to travel the entire world.</i>
ethnicity	The quality or fact of belonging to a population group or subgroup made up of people who share a common cultural background or descent. <i>The interrelationship between gender ethnicity and class.</i>
experience	Go through mental or physical states or experiences. <i>He recalled the experience vividly.</i>
genome	The complete set of genes or genetic material present in a cell or organism. <i>The human genome contains approximately three billion chemical base pairs.</i>
human	Showing the better qualities of humankind such as kindness. <i>Human frailty.</i>
humanity	The quality of being humane. <i>He praised them for their standards of humanity and care.</i>
humankind	All of the living human inhabitants of the earth. <i>She always used humankind because mankind seemed to slight the women.</i>
incarnation	The form taken by a person or thing during an incarnation. <i>Rama was Vishnu s incarnation on earth.</i>
individual	Of or for a particular person. <i>Individual drops of rain.</i>
laddie	A boy or young man (often as a form of address). <i>He s just a wee laddie.</i>
lifelong	Continuing through life. <i>His lifelong study of Greek art.</i>
lifespan	The length of time for which a person or animal lives or a thing functions. <i>The human lifespan.</i>
macho	Masculine in an overly assertive or aggressive way. <i>The big macho tough guy.</i>
mankind	Men, as distinct from women. <i>She always used humankind because mankind seemed to slight the women.</i>
nobody	A person of no influence. <i>They went from nobodies to superstars.</i>

<u>organism</u>	The material structure of an organism. <i>The heart s contribution to the maintenance of the human organism.</i>
overcrowd	Fill (accommodation or a space) beyond what is comfortable, safe, or desirable. <i>The students overcrowded the cafeteria.</i>
person	A category used in the classification of pronouns possessive determiners and verb forms according to whether they indicate the speaker first person the addressee second person or a third party third person. <i>A weapon was hidden on his person.</i>
<u>polarize</u>	Become polarized in a conflict or contrasting situation. <i>Polarized laser light.</i>
predestine	Foreordain or determine beforehand. <i>Calvinists believed that every person was predestined by God to go to heaven or to hell.</i>
somebody	A human being.

<u>who</u>	A United Nations agency to coordinate international health activities and to help governments improve health services.
<u>whole</u>	Acting together as a single undiversified whole. <i>Whole in mind and body.</i>
