Associations of "Light hearted" (30 Words)

auroral	Characteristic of the dawn. <i>A dim auroral glow.</i>
<u>bask</u>	Be exposed. <i>The seals came ashore to breed and to bask.</i>
<u>beam</u>	Express with a beaming face or smile. <i>The sun s rays beamed down.</i>
<u>bright</u>	Brightly. <i>Some children are brighter in one subject than another.</i>
<u>brightness</u>	Success and happiness. <i>The brightness will linger through Wednesday.</i>
brilliance	Vividness of colour. <i>Lapis lazuli was highly regarded for the brilliance of its colour.</i>
brilliantly	In an exceptionally clever or talented way. <i>At night the town was brilliantly lit.</i>
<u>dazzling</u>	Extremely impressive, beautiful, or skilful. <i>A dazzling display of football.</i>
emitter	A thing which emits something. <i>Infrared emitters.</i>
flash	A newsflash. <i>A flash of emotion swept over him.</i>
<u>gleam</u>	A faint or brief light, especially one reflected from something. <i>She saw a gleam of triumph in his eyes.</i>
glimmer	A flash of light (especially reflected light). <i>The moonlight glimmered on the lawn.</i>
glisten	(of something wet or greasy) shine with a sparkling light. <i>His eyes were glistening.</i>

glitter	Shine with a bright, shimmering reflected light. <i>Sneakers trimmed with sequins and glitter.</i>
glow	A strong feeling of pleasure or well-being. <i>With a glow of pride Mildred walked away.</i>
illuminate	Make (something) visible or bright by shining light on it; light up. <i>This is a carefully written large format manuscript illuminated by Leonardo Bellini.</i>
illumination	A condition of spiritual awareness divine illumination. <i>These books form the most sustained analysis and illumination of the subject.</i>
illumine	Enlighten (someone) spiritually or intellectually. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illuminated.</i>
lamp	Hunt at night using lamps especially for rabbits. <i>A table lamp.</i>
luminosity	The rate of emission of radiation, visible or otherwise. <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and luminosity.</i>
phosphorescent	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. <i>The phosphorescent glow of decaying wood.</i>
radiance	An attractive combination of good health and happiness. <i>The radiance of the sunset dwindled and died.</i>
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>A radiant heater.</i>
radiation	Syndrome resulting from exposure to ionizing radiation e.g. exposure to radioactive chemicals or to nuclear explosions low doses cause diarrhea and nausea and vomiting and sometimes loss of hair greater exposure can cause sterility and cataracts and some forms of cancer and other diseases severe exposure can cause death within hours. <i>Ultraviolet and infrared radiations.</i>
ray	Emit as rays. <i>The sun rays forth its natural light into the air.</i>
shine	Make a surface shine. <i>His shoes were shined to perfection.</i>
spectroscopy	The use of spectrometers to analyze spectra.
sunlight	The rays of the sun. <i>A shaft of sunlight.</i>

sunshine

Used as a friendly or sometimes threatening form of address.
*Hand it over **sunshine**.*

ultraviolet

Of equipment or techniques using or concerned with ultraviolet radiation.
*An **ultraviolet** telescope.*
