- The probability of a specified outcome.

chance The occurrence of events in the absence of any obvious intention or cause.

He played down his **chance**s of becoming chairman.

conceivability The state of being conceivable.

feasibilityThe state or degree of being easily or conveniently done.
The **feasibility** of screening athletes for cardiac disease.

likeliness The probability of a specified outcome.

odds

The chances or likelihood of something happening or being the case.

He offered **odds** of two to one.

plausibility

The quality of seeming reasonable or probable.

He offers no support for the **plausibility** of his theory.

possibility Capability of existing or happening or being true.

There was the **possibility** that he might be turned down.



probability A probable or the most probable event.

For a time revolution was a strong **probability**.

prospect A prediction of the course of a disease.

Norwich s unbeaten heavyweight **prospect**.

Apparently reasonable and valid, and truthful.

It seems **plausible** that one of two things may happen.

A thing that may be chosen or done out of several possible alternatives.

possibility There is no **possibility** of any government achieving this level of

expenditure.

The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition.

The **possible** effects of global warming.

potential The inherent capacity for coming into being.

Measurements of induced electrical **potential**s.

An aptitude that may be developed.

potentiality The technology is still relatively not well known in spite of its great

potentiality.

Having or put to a practical purpose or use.

A **practical** knowledge of Japanese.

presumable Capable of being inferred on slight grounds.

Affording reasonable grounds for belief or acceptance.

presumptive

A strong presumptive case is made out.

Based on or adapted to a theory of probability; subject to or involving

probabilistic chance variation.

The main approaches are either rule based or **probabilistic**.

The quality of being probable; a probable event or the most probable
