perpetual	Never ending or changing. <i>The perpetual struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.</i>
renewable	(of a natural resource or source of energy) not depleted when used. <i>We are on renewable annual contracts.</i>
<u>unbounded</u>	Seemingly boundless in amount, number, degree, or especially extent. <i>The possibilities are unbounded.</i>
<u>unchecked</u>	Not restrained or controlled. <i>Prices rose unchecked hitting the poor worst of all.</i>
undirected	Aimlessly drifting. <i>She was full of ineffectual undirected anger.</i>
