illimitable	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. The illimitable human capacity for evil.
measureless	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
<u>unbounded</u>	Having or appearing to have no limits. Unbounded enthusiasm.
unlimited	(of a problem) having an infinite number of solutions. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not</i> unlimited .



unmeasured Not composed of measured syllables; not metrical. The long **unmeasured** pulse of time moves everything There is nothing hidden that it cannot bring to light nothing once known that may not become unknown.

inestimable	Too great to calculate. Jewels of inestimable value.
inexhaustible	That cannot be entirely consumed or used up. An inexhaustible supply of coal.
<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. The infinite number of stars in the universe.
<u>infinity</u>	The state or quality of being infinite. <i>The lawns stretched into infinity.</i>
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. We got bogged down in interminable discussions.
measureless	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
<u>myriad</u>	Having countless or very many elements or aspects. <i>He gazed at the myriad lights of the city.</i>
permanently	In a way that lasts or remains unchanged indefinitely; for all time. We need to be permanently vigilant.
perpetual	Never ending or changing. The perpetual struggle to maintain standards in a democracy.
renewable	(of a natural resource or source of energy) not depleted when used. We are on renewable annual contracts.
<u>unbounded</u>	Seemingly boundless in amount, number, degree, or especially extent. <i>The possibilities are unbounded</i> .
<u>unchecked</u>	Not restrained or controlled. Prices rose unchecked hitting the poor worst of all.
undirected	Aimlessly drifting. She was full of ineffectual undirected anger.



<u>undying</u>	(especially of an emotion) lasting forever. <i>His undying fame.</i>
unfettered	Not bound by shackles and chains. Unfettered artistic genius.
<u>uninhibited</u>	Not having been restrained or suppressed. <i>Uninhibited</i> exuberance.
unlimited	Having no limits in range or scope- Philip Rahv. To start with a theory of unlimited freedom is to end up with unlimited despotism.
<u>unrestrained</u>	Not restrained or restricted. A display of unrestrained delight.
unrestricted	Accessible to all. Unrestricted access to both military bases.
