

philologyThe branch of knowledge that deals with the structure, historical

development, and relationships of a language or languages.

phonetic Relating to phonetics.

Phonetic training.

phonologyThe branch of linguistics that deals with systems of sounds (including or

excluding phonetics), within a language or between different languages.

The branch of linguistics and logic concerned with meaning The two main areas are logical semantics concerned with matters such as sense and

semantics reference and presupposition and implication and lexical semantics

concerned with the analysis of word meanings and relations between them.

speech A person's style of speaking.

A language user's knowledge of words.

The term became part of business **vocabulary**.

vowel A letter representing a vowel sound such as a e i o u.

word A word is a string of bits stored in computer memory.
