## Lips as a Noun

### Definitions of "Lips" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “lips” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Either the outer margin or the inner margin of the aperture of a gastropod's shell.*
- *Either of the two parts of a bilabiate corolla or calyx.*
- *Either of two fleshy folds of tissue that surround the mouth and play a role in speaking.*
- *(botany) either of the two parts of a bilabiate corolla or calyx.*
- *The top edge of a vessel or other container.*
- *An impudent or insolent rejoinder.*



## Synonyms of "Lips" as a noun (7 Words)

- back talk** The position of a player on a football team who is stationed behind the line of scrimmage.
- backtalk** An impudent or insolent rejoinder.
- brim** The projecting edge at the bottom of a hat.  
*A soft hat with a turned up **brim**.*
- mouth** An opening that resembles a mouth as of a cave or a gorge.  
*The carp picks up the bait by sucking it into its **mouth**.*
- rim** The part of a spectacle frame surrounding the lenses.  
*A china egg cup with a gold **rim**.*
- sass** Impudence; cheek.  
*Don't give me any of your **sass**.*
- sassing** An impudent or insolent rejoinder.





## Associations of "Lips" (30 Words)

<b>anoint</b>	Administer an oil or ointment to; often in a religious ceremony of blessing. <i>He was <b>anointed</b> as the organizational candidate of the party.</i>
<b>boldness</b>	Confidence to an impudent or presumptuous degree. <i>I couldn't believe her <b>boldness</b>.</i>
<b>brim</b>	Fill something so completely that it almost overflows. <i>He is <b>brimming</b> with ideas.</i>
<b>brow</b>	An eyebrow. <i>He wiped his <b>brow</b>.</i>
<b>cheek</b>	Either of the two large fleshy masses of muscular tissue that form the human rump. <i>He had the <b>cheek</b> to complain.</i>
<b>chin</b>	Raise oneself while hanging from one's hands until one's chin is level with the support bar. <i>Grey stubble covered his cheeks and <b>chin</b>.</i>
<b>cleft</b>	Split or divided. <i>A <b>cleft</b> stick.</i>
<a href="#">crevice</a>	A narrow opening or fissure, especially in a rock or wall. <i>Many creatures hide in <b>crevices</b> in the rock.</i>
<b>embouchure</b>	The mouth of a river or valley.
<b>epiglottis</b>	A flap of cartilage that covers the windpipe while swallowing.
<b>eyebrow</b>	The strip of hair growing on the ridge above a person's eye socket. <i>He had eyes of blue beneath bushy <b>eyebrows</b>.</i>
<b>fissure</b>	Break into fissures or fine cracks. <i>A <b>fissure</b> between philosophy and reality.</i>
<b>forehead</b>	The part of the face above the eyes.
<a href="#">gall</a>	An animal's gall bladder. <i>Accept life's <b>gall</b> without blaming somebody else.</i>
<b>halitosis</b>	Offensive breath.
<b>hyoid</b>	Relating to the hyoid or structures associated with it.
<b>impertinence</b>	Inappropriate playfulness. <i>They gasped at the <b>impertinence</b> of the suggestion.</i>
<b>impudence</b>	The trait of being rude and impertinent; inclined to take liberties. <i>His arrogance and <b>impudence</b> had offended many.</i>

<b>insolence</b>	The trait of being rude and impertinent; inclined to take liberties. <i>She was sacked for <b>insolence</b>.</i>
<b>jaw</b>	The lower movable bone of the jaw or the part of the face containing it. <i>He <b>jawed</b> his bubble gum.</i>
<b>kiss</b>	The act of caressing with the lips (or an instance thereof). <i>The blossoms were <b>kissed</b> by the soft rain.</i>
<b>larynx</b>	A cartilaginous structure at the top of the trachea; contains elastic vocal cords that are the source of the vocal tone in speech.
<b>lingua</b>	A mobile mass of muscular tissue covered with mucous membrane and located in the oral cavity.
<b><u>mouth</u></b>	A horse's readiness to feel and obey the pressure of the bit in its mouth. <i>They built a fire at the <b>mouth</b> of the cave.</i>
<b><u>nose</u></b>	Push or move with the nose. <i>The dog <b>nosed</b> out the drugs.</i>
<b>palate</b>	A person's ability to distinguish between and appreciate different flavours. <i>The suggestions may not suit everyone's <b>palate</b>.</i>
<b><u>throat</u></b>	A passage resembling a throat in shape or function. <i>From a hundred <b>throats</b> came the cry Vive l'Empereur.</i>
<b><u>tongue</u></b>	The tongue of certain animals used as meat. <i>He was a redoubtable debater with a caustic <b>tongue</b>.</i>
<b>verbally</b>	As a verb. <i>She claimed to have been <b>verbally</b> abused.</i>
