- *He took a course in Russian lit.*



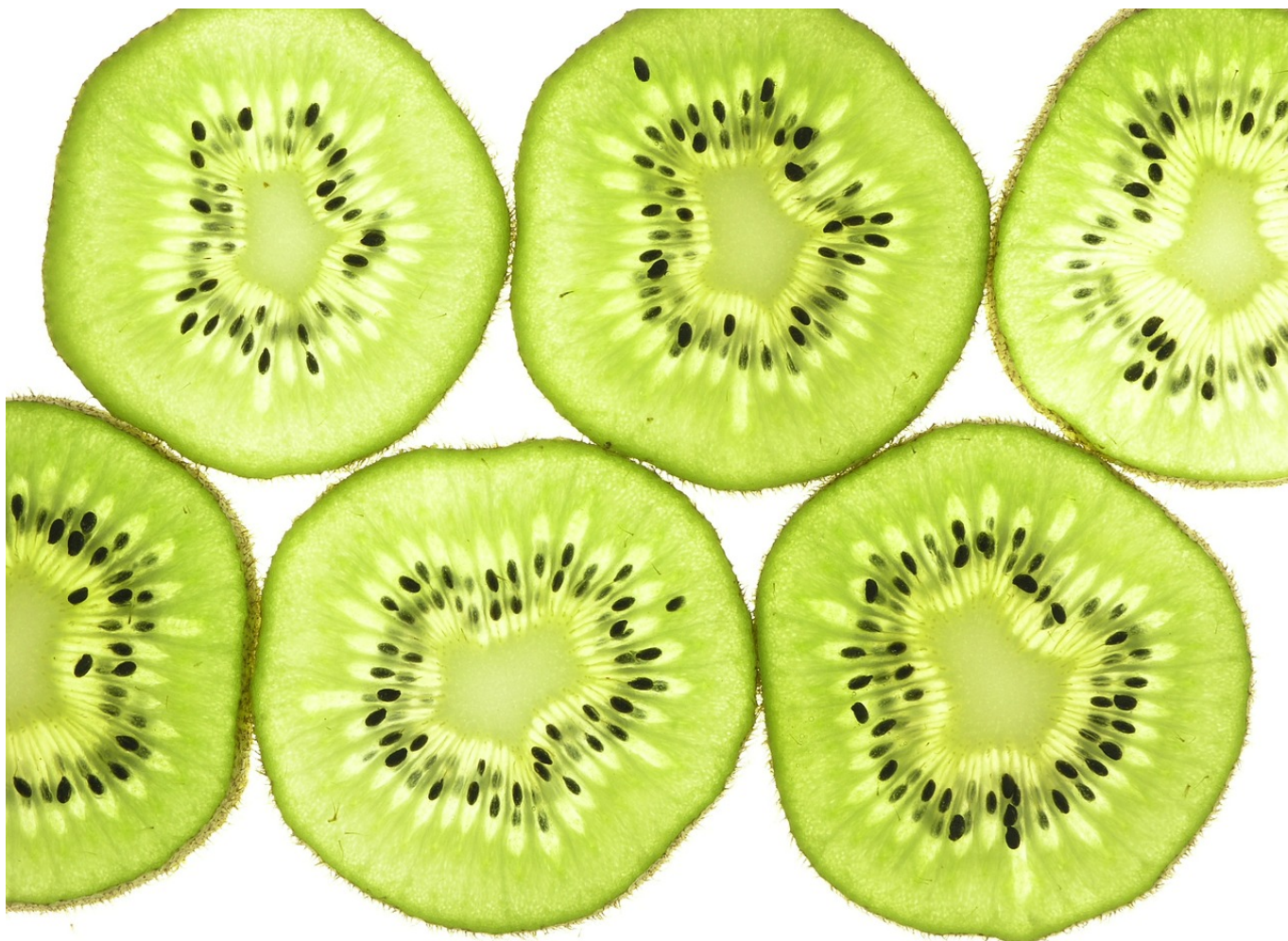
## Lit as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Lit" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "lit" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Provided with artificial light.*
- *Very good, impressive, or exciting.*
- *Provided with light or lighting; illuminated.*
- *Set afire or burning.*
- *Having been ignited; burning.*
- *Drunk.*





### Synonyms of "Lit" as an adjective (3 Words)

- illuminated** (of a manuscript) having pages or letters decorated by hand with gold, silver, or coloured designs.  
*An important collection of medieval **illuminated** manuscripts.*
- lighted** Moving easily and quickly; nimble.  
*A **lighted** cigarette.*
- well-lighted** Provided with artificial light.



## Usage Examples of "Lit" as an adjective

- *A lit firecracker.*
- *A brightly lit room.*
- *My birthday party was lit!*
- *A lit cigarette.*
- *Leaving the safety of a lit street.*
- *Some friends and I got lit up.*
- *A lit window at dusk.*
