**ability to read and write**The quality of being able to perform; a quality that permits or facilitates achievement or accomplishment.


**reading ability**A datum about some physical state that is presented to a user by a meter or similar instrument.

writing ability The collected work of an author.writing proficiency The act of creating written works.








### Usage Examples of "Literacy" as a noun
