<b>acrobatic</b>	Performing, involving, or adept at spectacular gymnastic feats. <i>An <b>acrobatic</b> dive.</i>
<b>agile</b>	Relating to or denoting a method of project management, used especially for software development, that is characterized by the division of tasks into short phases of work and frequent reassessment and adaptation of plans. <i>His vague manner concealed an <b>agile</b> mind.</i>
<b>deft</b>	Neatly skilful and quick in one's movements. <i><b>Deft</b> fingers massaged her face.</i>
<b>fit</b>	Meeting adequate standards for a purpose. <i>The measures would ensure a leaner <b>fitter</b> company.</i>
<b>flexible</b>	Making or willing to make concessions. <i><b>Flexible</b> schedules.</i>
<b>graceful</b>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b>.</i>
<b>limber</b>	Capable of moving or bending freely. <i><b>Limber</b> graphite fishing rods.</i>
<b>lissom</b>	(of a person or their body) thin, supple, and graceful. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to <b>lissom</b> teenagers.</i>
<b>lissome</b>	Gracefully thin and bending and moving with ease.
<b>lithesome</b>	Moving and bending with ease.
<b>nimble</b>	Quick and light in movement or action; agile. <i><b>Nimble</b> fingers.</i>
<b>pliable</b>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i>They soaked the leather to made it <b>pliable</b>.</i>
<b>pliant</b>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i><b>Pliant</b> willow stems.</i>
<b>sinuous</b>	Having many curves and turns. <i>The river follows a <b>sinuous</b> trail through the dale.</i>
<b>spry</b>	Moving quickly and lightly. <i>He continued to look <b>spry</b> and active well into his eighties.</i>
<b>supple</b>	(used of e.g. personality traits) readily adaptable. <i>My mind is becoming more <b>supple</b>.</i>
<b>willowy</b>	(of a person) tall, slim, and lithe. <i>A beautiful <b>willowy</b> blonde.</i>

<b>befriend</b>	Act as or become a friend to (someone), especially when they are in need of help or support. <i>He makes a point of <b>befriending</b> newcomers to Parliament.</i>
<b>bony</b>	Having bones especially many or prominent bones. <i>Her <b>bony</b> wrist.</i>
<b>cultivated</b>	Marked by refinement in taste and manners. <i>He was a remarkably <b>cultivated</b> and educated man.</i>
<b>debonair</b>	Having a sophisticated charm. <i>All the men looked <b>debonair</b> and handsome in white tie and tails.</i>
<b>folk</b>	Relating to folk music. <i>An old <b>folks</b> home.</i>

<b>grace</b>	In Greek mythology three beautiful goddesses Aglaia Thalia and Euphrosyne believed to personify and bestow charm grace and beauty. <i>She has all the social <b>graces</b>.</i>
<b>graceful</b>	Characterized by beauty of movement, style, form, or execution. <i>She was a tall girl slender and <b>graceful</b>.</i>
<b>lank</b>	Of a person lanky. <i>Grown <b>lank</b> with fasting.</i>
<b>lanky</b>	(of a person) ungracefully thin and tall. <i>A <b>lanky</b> kid transformed almost overnight into a handsome young man.</i>
<b>limber</b>	Cause to become limber. <i>I have to practise to keep myself <b>limber</b>.</i>
<b>lissom</b>	(of a person or their body) thin, supple, and graceful. <i>The kind of outfit that should be left to <b>lissom</b> teenagers.</i>
<b>mincing</b>	Affectedly dainty or refined. <i>I don't have to go through the rest of my life with that <b>mincing</b> voice of yours.</i>
<b>narrow</b>	A narrow channel connecting two larger areas of water. <i>Companies fail through their <b>narrow</b> view of what contributes to profit.</i>

<b>orphan</b>	Make a child an orphan. <i>An <b>orphan</b> girl.</i>
<b><u>refined</u></b>	With impurities or unwanted elements having been removed by processing. <i>Her voice was very low and <b>refined</b>.</i>
<b><u>silhouette</u></b>	Represent by a silhouette. <i>The castle was <b>silhouetted</b> against the sky.</i>
<b><u>skinny</u></b>	A skinny person. <i>A pair of <b>skinny</b> cords.</i>
<b><u>slender</u></b>	Being of delicate or slender build Frank Norris. <i>People of <b>slender</b> means.</i>
<b>slim</b>	Of a garment cut on slender lines designed to make the wearer appear slim. <i>A sponsored <b>slim</b>.</i>
<b><u>sophisticated</u></b>	Appealing to or frequented by people who are sophisticated. <i>A <b>sophisticated</b> drama.</i>
<b><u>supple</u></b>	Moving and bending with ease. <i>A <b>supple</b> mind.</i>
<b>svelte</b>	Moving and bending with ease. <i>She was <b>svelte</b> and sophisticated.</i>
<b>tall</b>	A garment size for a tall person. <i>He was over six feet <b>tall</b>.</i>
<b><u>thin</u></b>	Lose thickness become thin or thinner. <i>The <b>thin</b> cold air of the mountains.</i>
<b>thinness</b>	The quality of a liquid substance not containing much solid. <i>There s enough action to camouflage the <b>thinness</b> of the plot.</i>
<b>tiny</b>	Very small. <i>A <b>tiny</b> hummingbird.</i>
<b>urbane</b>	Showing a high degree of refinement and the assurance that comes from wide social experience. <i><b>Urbane</b> wit was the mark of taste and cultivation.</i>
<b>waif</b>	A homeless child especially one forsaken or orphaned. <i>A little shop presided over by a Gothic <b>waif</b> in purple eyeshadow and lipstick.</i>
<b>willowy</b>	(of a person) tall, slim, and lithe. <i><b>Willowy</b> meadow land.</i>
