## Associations of "Long lasting" (30 Words)

<b>abiding</b>	Lasting a long time. <i>He had an <b>abiding</b> respect for her.</i>
<b>changeless</b>	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>constant</b>	A quantity or parameter that does not change its value whatever the value of the variables, under a given set of conditions. <i>These discs rotate at a <b>constant</b> speed.</i>
<b><u>continually</u></b>	Seemingly without interruption. <i>I was <b>continually</b> moving around.</i>
<b>continued</b>	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>The <b>continued</b> existence of nationalism.</i>
<b>continuing</b>	Without a break in continuity; ongoing. <i>A <b>continuing</b> controversy.</i>
<b>continuous</b>	(of a function) of which the graph is a smooth unbroken curve, i.e. one such that as the value of x approaches any given value a, the value of f(x) approaches that of f(a) as a limit. <i>A <b>continuous</b> line has no gaps or breaks in it.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	Without interruption or gaps. <i>These images loop <b>continuously</b>.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Having or seeming to have no end or limit. <i><b>Endless</b> loop cassette tapes.</i>
<b><u>endlessly</u></b>	All the time; seemingly without stopping. <i>The original episodes were <b>endlessly</b> repeated.</i>
<b><u>enduring</u></b>	Lasting over a period of time; durable. <i>He formed a number of <b>enduring</b> relationships with women.</i>

<b><u>eternal</u></b>	Seeming to last or persist forever, especially on account of being tedious or annoying. <i>She is an <b>eternal</b> optimist.</i>
<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Our biggest <b>ever</b> range.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>An <b>everlasting</b> reminder of this evening.</i>
<b><u>forever</u></b>	Lasting or permanent. <i>She took <b>forever</b> to write the paper.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>indefinitely</b>	To an unlimited or unspecified degree or extent. <i>Talks cannot go on <b>indefinitely</b>.</i>
<b>ineradicable</b>	Unable to be destroyed or removed. <i><b>Ineradicable</b> superstitions.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>An <b>interminable</b> sermon.</i>
<b>permanence</b>	The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. <i>The clarity and <b>permanence</b> of the dyes.</i>
<b>permanency</b>	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. <i>A <b>permanent</b> ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>A <b>perpetual</b> secretary of the society.</i>
<b>perpetuation</b>	The act of prolonging something. <i><b>Perpetuation</b> of the species is our purpose.</i>
<b>prolongation</b>	Amount or degree or range to which something extends. <i>There was an indefinite <b>prolongation</b> of the peace talks.</i>
<b><u>steady</u></b>	In a steady manner. <i>A <b>steady</b> increase.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
