| elongate         | Long in relation to width elongated.<br>The pup s globular body slowly <b>elongate</b> s.   |
| <u>elongated</u> | Drawn out or made longer spatially.<br>The old man s gaunt and <b>elongated</b> frame.  |
| endlessly        | With unflagging resolve.<br>An <b>endlessly</b> fascinating subject.  |
| <u>extend</u>    | Extend in scope or range or area.<br><i>Extend</i> a loan.  |
| extended         | Fully extended or stretched forth.<br>An <b>extended</b> telescope.   |
| extensible       | Capable of being protruded or stretched or opened out.<br>An <b>extensible</b> measuring rule.  |
| furlong          | An eighth of a mile, 220 yards.   |
| indefinitely     | To an unlimited or unspecified degree or extent.<br>An <b>indefinitely</b> large number of channels.  |



| jog              | A spell of jogging.<br>They caught and saddled their horses and <b>jog</b> ged up to the high grass<br>moorland.  |

| jogger           | Loose trousers made of a stretchy fabric and typically elasticated at the waist and ankles, worn especially for jogging. <i>Sporty types in <b>jogger</b>s.</i> |
| lengthen         | Make longer.<br>In Spring the days <b>lengthen</b> .  |
| lengthy          | (especially in reference to time) of considerable or unusual length, especially so as to be tedious. <i>Lengthy delays.</i>                                     |
| marathon         | A long-lasting or difficult task or activity.<br>The last leg of an interview <b>marathon</b> which began this summer.  |
| outstretched     | (especially of a hand or arm) extended or stretched out.<br>She reached across and shook his <b>outstretched</b> hand.  |
| <u>postpone</u>  | Hold back to a later time.<br>Let s <b>postpone</b> the exam.   |
| proceed          | Continue talking.<br>From the High Street <b>proceed</b> over Magdalen Bridge.  |
| prolongation     | Extension of the duration of something.<br>The position is advertised for two years but <b>prolongation</b> is possible.  |
| <u>prolonged</u> | Drawn out or made longer spatially.<br>A <b>prolonged</b> and bitter struggle.  |
| protracted       | Relatively long in duration tediously protracted.<br><b>Protracted</b> negotiations.  |
| runner           | A plant that spreads by means of runners.<br><i>The vegetable baskets were on <b>runner</b>s.</i>   |
| running          | Executed or initiated by running.<br>In <b>running</b> or working order.  |
| <u>sprint</u>    | A short, fast race in which the competitors run a distance of 400 metres or less.<br>A <b>sprint</b> planning session.  |
| stretched        | Extended or spread over a wide area or distance.<br>Well <b>stretched</b> muscles are less susceptible to injury.   |
| stroller         | A young urban vagrant; a street child.<br>Shady gardens where <b>stroller</b> s could relax.  |



| trainer  | Simulator consisting of a machine on the ground that simulates the conditions of flying a plane.<br>A fitness <b>trainer</b> . |
