Associations of "Long run" (30 Words)

bypass	An alternative channel created during a bypass operation. <i>Bypass the farm and continue to the road.</i>
circumvent	Avoid or try to avoid fulfilling, answering, or performing (duties, questions, or issues). <i>It was always possible to circumvent the regulations.</i>
dash	A horizontal stroke in writing or printing to mark a pause or break in sense or to represent omitted letters or words. <i>Dashed by the refusal.</i>
detour	Avoid by taking a detour. <i>He detoured around the walls.</i>
elongate	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>The pup s globular body slowly elongates.</i>
elongated	Drawn out or made longer spatially. <i>The old man s gaunt and elongated frame.</i>
endlessly	With unflagging resolve. <i>An endlessly fascinating subject.</i>
extend	Extend in scope or range or area. <i>Extend a loan.</i>
extended	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>An extended telescope.</i>
extensible	Capable of being protruded or stretched or opened out. <i>An extensible measuring rule.</i>
furlong	An eighth of a mile, 220 yards.
indefinitely	To an unlimited or unspecified degree or extent. <i>An indefinitely large number of channels.</i>

jog	A spell of jogging. <i>They caught and saddled their horses and jogged up to the high grass moorland.</i>
jogger	Loose trousers made of a stretchy fabric and typically elasticated at the waist and ankles, worn especially for jogging. <i>Sporty types in joggers.</i>
lengthen	Make longer. <i>In Spring the days lengthen.</i>
lengthy	(especially in reference to time) of considerable or unusual length, especially so as to be tedious. <i>Lengthy delays.</i>
marathon	A long-lasting or difficult task or activity. <i>The last leg of an interview marathon which began this summer.</i>
outstretched	(especially of a hand or arm) extended or stretched out. <i>She reached across and shook his outstretched hand.</i>
postpone	Hold back to a later time. <i>Let s postpone the exam.</i>
proceed	Continue talking. <i>From the High Street proceed over Magdalen Bridge.</i>
prolongation	Extension of the duration of something. <i>The position is advertised for two years but prolongation is possible.</i>
prolonged	Drawn out or made longer spatially. <i>A prolonged and bitter struggle.</i>
protracted	Relatively long in duration tediously protracted. <i>Protracted negotiations.</i>
runner	A plant that spreads by means of runners. <i>The vegetable baskets were on runners.</i>
running	Executed or initiated by running. <i>In running or working order.</i>
sprint	A short, fast race in which the competitors run a distance of 400 metres or less. <i>A sprint planning session.</i>
stretched	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. <i>Well stretched muscles are less susceptible to injury.</i>
stroller	A young urban vagrant; a street child. <i>Shady gardens where strollers could relax.</i>

- trainer** Simulator consisting of a machine on the ground that simulates the conditions of flying a plane.
*A fitness **trainer**.*
- urgently** In a way which requires immediate action or attention.
*Housing is **urgently** needed.*
