Associations of "Long standing" (30 Words)

confirmed	(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. <i>A confirmed bachelor.</i>
continued	Without stop or interruption. <i>The continued popularity of Westerns.</i>
continuously	Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals. <i>These images loop continuously.</i>
elongate	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>The old man s gaunt and elongated frame.</i>
elongated	Drawn out or made longer spatially. <i>An alien being with an elongated head.</i>
endless	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i>Time is endless.</i>
enduring	Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble. <i>An enduring disposition.</i>
ever	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>They lived happily ever after.</i>
extend	Extend in scope or range or area. <i>Extend the loan.</i>
extended	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>An extended discussion.</i>
forever	Without interruption. <i>She took forever to write the paper.</i>
incessantly	Without interruption; constantly. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
indefinitely	For an unlimited or unspecified period of time. <i>Talks cannot go on indefinitely.</i>

interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>We got bogged down in interminable discussions.</i>
lank	Of a person lanky. <i>The man had lank brown greasy hair.</i>
lasting	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A long lasting friendship.</i>
length	The length of a horse boat etc as a measure of the lead in a race. <i>A length of brown satin.</i>
lengthen	Make or become longer. <i>The mascara will lengthen your lashes.</i>
lengthy	Relatively long in duration; tediously protracted. <i>A lengthy visit from her mother in law.</i>
longitudinal	Relating to longitude; measured from east to west. <i>Longitudinal muscles.</i>
perpetual	(of an investment) having no fixed maturity date; irredeemable. <i>A perpetual secretary of the society.</i>
perpetuation	The continuation or preservation of a situation, idea, etc. <i>We criticized the perpetuation of racial stereotypes.</i>
postpone	Cause or arrange for (something) to take place at a time later than that first scheduled. <i>The visit had to be postponed for some time.</i>
prolongation	The consequence of being lengthened in duration. <i>The position is advertised for two years but prolongation is possible.</i>
protracted	Relatively long in duration tediously protracted. <i>Protracted negotiations.</i>
spindly	Long and lean. <i>Spindly chairs.</i>
stretched	Relieved of stiffness by stretching. <i>Broad fields lay stretched on both sides of us.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
unlimited	Without reservation or exception. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
