outstretched Fully extended especially in length.

She reached across and shook his **outstretched** hand.

**period** A set of elements occupying a horizontal row in the periodic table.

He interviewed the teachers when they had a free **period**.

The continuation or preservation of a situation, idea, etc.

**Derpetuation**We criticized the **perpetuation** of racial stereotypes.

Hold back to a later time.

The visit had to be **postpone**d for some time.

Lengthen or extend in duration or space.
