## Associations of "Long term" (30 Words)

<b>buzzword</b>	Stock phrases that have become nonsense through endless repetition. <i>The latest <b>buzzword</b> in international travel is ecotourism.</i>
<b><u>continuation</u></b>	The consequence of being lengthened in duration. <i>The government s <b>continuation</b> in office.</i>
<b><u>detour</u></b>	Travel via a detour. <i>He <b>detoured</b> around the walls.</i>
<b>duration</b>	The period of time during which something continues. <i>The ceremony was of short <b>duration</b>.</i>
<b>elongate</b>	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>The pup s globular body slowly <b>elongates</b>.</i>
<b><u>elongated</u></b>	Long in relation to width, especially unusually so. <i>The males are smaller and have more <b>elongated</b> bodies.</i>
<b><u>enduring</u></b>	Unceasing. <i>An <b>enduring</b> disposition.</i>
<b><u>extend</u></b>	Extend in scope or range or area. <i>She <b>extended</b> her visit by another day.</i>
<b>extended</b>	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>An <b>extended</b> discussion.</i>
<b>extensible</b>	Capable of being protruded or stretched or opened out. <i>In a second she was out of the car <b>extensible</b> baton in hand.</i>
<b>indefinitely</b>	For an unlimited or unspecified period of time. <i>An <b>indefinitely</b> large number of channels.</i>
<b>jargon</b>	A characteristic language of a particular group (as among thieves). <i>Legal <b>jargon</b>.</i>
<b><u>length</u></b>	The length of a horse boat etc as a measure of the lead in a race. <i>The delta is twenty kilometres in <b>length</b>.</i>

<b>lengthen</b>	Become long or longer. <i>In Spring the days <b>lengthen</b>.</i>
<b>lengthy</b>	(especially in reference to time) of considerable or unusual length, especially so as to be tedious. <i>A <b>lengthy</b> visit from her mother in law.</i>
<b>missive</b>	A written message addressed to a person or organization. <i>Yet another <b>missive</b> from the Foreign Office.</i>
<b>outstretched</b>	Fully extended especially in length. <i>She reached across and shook his <b>outstretched</b> hand.</i>
<b>period</b>	A set of elements occupying a horizontal row in the periodic table. <i>He interviewed the teachers when they had a free <b>period</b>.</i>
<b>perpetuation</b>	The continuation or preservation of a situation, idea, etc. <i>We criticized the <b>perpetuation</b> of racial stereotypes.</i>
<b>postpone</b>	Hold back to a later time. <i>The visit had to be <b>postponed</b> for some time.</i>
<b>prolong</b>	Lengthen or extend in duration or space. <i>We <b>prolonged</b> our stay.</i>
<b>prolongation</b>	Amount or degree or range to which something extends. <i>An examiner analysed the angle formed by the <b>prolongations</b> of the lines.</i>
<b>prolonged</b>	Drawn out or made longer spatially. <i>A <b>prolonged</b> black line across the page.</i>
<b>protract</b>	Prolong. <i>He had certainly taken his time even <b>protracting</b> the process.</i>
<b>protracted</b>	Relatively long in duration tediously protracted. <i><b>Protracted</b> negotiations.</i>
<b>slang</b>	Use slang or vulgar language. <i>Their speech was full of <b>slang</b> expressions.</i>
<b>stretch</b>	Easily stretched. <i><b>Stretch</b> the elastic.</i>
<b>stretched</b>	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. <i>Well <b>stretched</b> muscles are less susceptible to injury.</i>
<b>stretching</b>	Act of expanding by lengthening or widening.
<b>unlimited</b>	(of a problem) having an infinite number of solutions. <i>To start with a theory of <b>unlimited</b> freedom is to end up with <b>unlimited</b> despotism.</i>
