Associations of "Long term" (30 Words)

buzzword	Stock phrases that have become nonsense through endless repetition. <i>The latest buzzword in international travel is ecotourism.</i>
<u>continuation</u>	The consequence of being lengthened in duration. <i>The government s continuation in office.</i>
<u>detour</u>	Travel via a detour. <i>He detoured around the walls.</i>
duration	The period of time during which something continues. <i>The ceremony was of short duration.</i>
elongate	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>The pup s globular body slowly elongates.</i>
<u>elongated</u>	Long in relation to width, especially unusually so. <i>The males are smaller and have more elongated bodies.</i>
<u>enduring</u>	Unceasing. <i>An enduring disposition.</i>
<u>extend</u>	Extend in scope or range or area. <i>She extended her visit by another day.</i>
extended	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>An extended discussion.</i>
extensible	Capable of being protruded or stretched or opened out. <i>In a second she was out of the car extensible baton in hand.</i>
indefinitely	For an unlimited or unspecified period of time. <i>An indefinitely large number of channels.</i>
jargon	A characteristic language of a particular group (as among thieves). <i>Legal jargon.</i>
<u>length</u>	The length of a horse boat etc as a measure of the lead in a race. <i>The delta is twenty kilometres in length.</i>

lengthen	Become long or longer. <i>In Spring the days lengthen.</i>
lengthy	(especially in reference to time) of considerable or unusual length, especially so as to be tedious. <i>A lengthy visit from her mother in law.</i>
missive	A written message addressed to a person or organization. <i>Yet another missive from the Foreign Office.</i>
outstretched	Fully extended especially in length. <i>She reached across and shook his outstretched hand.</i>
period	A set of elements occupying a horizontal row in the periodic table. <i>He interviewed the teachers when they had a free period.</i>
perpetuation	The continuation or preservation of a situation, idea, etc. <i>We criticized the perpetuation of racial stereotypes.</i>
postpone	Hold back to a later time. <i>The visit had to be postponed for some time.</i>
prolong	Lengthen or extend in duration or space. <i>We prolonged our stay.</i>
prolongation	Amount or degree or range to which something extends. <i>An examiner analysed the angle formed by the prolongations of the lines.</i>
prolonged	Drawn out or made longer spatially. <i>A prolonged black line across the page.</i>
protract	Prolong. <i>He had certainly taken his time even protracting the process.</i>
protracted	Relatively long in duration tediously protracted. <i>Protracted negotiations.</i>
slang	Use slang or vulgar language. <i>Their speech was full of slang expressions.</i>
stretch	Easily stretched. <i>Stretch the elastic.</i>
stretched	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. <i>Well stretched muscles are less susceptible to injury.</i>
stretching	Act of expanding by lengthening or widening. (of a problem) having an infinite number of solutions.
unlimited	<i>To start with a theory of unlimited freedom is to end up with unlimited despotism.</i>
