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## Associations of "Longs" (30 Words)

<b>continued</b>	Without stop or interruption. <i>He asked for their <b>continued</b> support.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>These images loop <b>continuously</b>.</i>
<b><u>detour</u></b>	Travel via a detour. <i>He <b>detoured</b> around the walls.</i>
<b>elongate</b>	Long in relation to width elongated. <i>The pup s globular body slowly <b>elongates</b>.</i>
<b><u>elongated</u></b>	Having notably more length than width; being long and slender. <i>The males are smaller and have more <b>elongated</b> bodies.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i><b>Endless</b> waves.</i>
<b><u>endlessly</u></b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>The original episodes were <b>endlessly</b> repeated.</i>
<b><u>enduring</u></b>	Lasting over a period of time; durable. <i>An <b>enduring</b> disposition.</i>
<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Did you <b>ever</b> smoke.</i>
<b><u>extend</u></b>	Extend in scope or range or area. <i>Hold the index finger down with the thumb <b>extended</b>.</i>
<b>extended</b>	Fully extended or stretched forth. <i>The <b>extended</b> airport runways can accommodate larger planes.</i>
<b>extensible</b>	Designed to allow the addition of new capabilities and functionality. <i>In a second she was out of the car <b>extensible</b> baton in hand.</i>
<b><u>forever</u></b>	For a limitless time- P.P.Bliss. <i>No one can live <b>forever</b>.</i>

<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>indefinitely</b>	To an indefinite extent; for an indefinite time. <i>An <b>indefinitely</b> large number of channels.</i>
<b>infinitely</b>	Continuing forever without end. <i>A sweet <b>infinitely</b> watchable performance.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>An <b>interminable</b> sermon.</i>
<b>length</b>	The length of a swimming pool as a measure of the distance swum. <i>The <b>length</b> of the syllable is isomorphic with the <b>length</b> of the syllabic vowel.</i>
<b>lengthen</b>	Make longer. <i>In the spring when the days are <b>lengthening</b>.</i>
<b>lengthy</b>	Relatively long in duration; tediously protracted. <i><b>Lengthy</b> delays.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>Their <b>perpetual</b> money worries.</i>
<b>perpetuation</b>	The act of prolonging something. <i><b>Perpetuation</b> of the species is our purpose.</i>
<b>postpone</b>	Hold back to a later time. <i>He <b>postponed</b> implementing the scheme until industry and business were consulted.</i>
<b>prolongation</b>	Amount or degree or range to which something extends. <i>An agreement on further <b>prolongation</b> of the boundary proved difficult.</i>
<b>prolonged</b>	Drawn out or made longer spatially. <i>The region suffered a <b>prolonged</b> drought.</i>
<b>protracted</b>	Relatively long in duration tediously protracted. <i>A <b>protracted</b> and bitter dispute.</i>
<b>stretch</b>	Become longer by being stretched and pulled. <i><b>Stretch</b> the soup by adding some more cream.</i>
<b>stretched</b>	Extended or spread over a wide area or distance. <i>Broad fields lay <b>stretched</b> on both sides of us.</i>
<b>stretching</b>	Act of expanding by lengthening or widening.
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
