## Associations of "Look down upon" (30 Words)

<b>appear</b>	Appear as a character on stage or appear in a play etc. <i>He <b>appeared</b> on Broadway.</i>
<b><a href="#">askance</a></b>	With an attitude or look of suspicion or disapproval. <i>Her eyes with their misted <b>askance</b> look.</i>
<b><a href="#">browse</a></b>	Reading superficially or at random. <i>They reach upward to <b>browse</b> on bushes.</i>
<b>contented</b>	Feeling or expressing happiness or satisfaction. <i>She gave a <b>contented</b> little smile.</i>
<b>descend</b>	Come from; be connected by a relationship of blood, for example. <i>A side road <b>descended</b> into the forest.</i>
<b>descending</b>	Moving or sloping downwards. <i>A passage of <b>descending</b> chords.</i>
<b><a href="#">descent</a></b>	An unexpected visit. <i>A <b>descent</b> on the Channel ports.</i>
<b><a href="#">falling</a></b>	Becoming lower or less in degree or value. <i><b>Falling</b> standards.</i>
<b>fixate</b>	Cause (someone) to develop an obsessive attachment to someone or something. <i>Her eyes <b>fixated</b> on a point on the horizon.</i>
<b>gape</b>	A disease of birds with gaping of the mouth as a symptom caused by infestation with gapeworm. <i>A <b>gape</b> of the jaws.</i>
<b><a href="#">gawk</a></b>	An awkward stupid person. <i>They were <b>gawking</b> at some pin up.</i>
<b><a href="#">gaze</a></b>	A long fixed look. <i>He turned following her <b>gaze</b>.</i>

<b>glance</b>	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. <i>Fish sporting with quick <b>glance</b> Show to the Sun their wavy coats.</i>
<b><u>glimpse</u></b>	Catch a glimpse of or see briefly. <i>She caught a <b>glimpse</b> of the ocean.</i>
<b>hairstyle</b>	A particular way in which a person's hair is cut or arranged.
<b><u>low</u></b>	Low or inferior in station or quality. <i>I was feeling <b>low</b>.</i>
<b>observing</b>	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
<b>onlooker</b>	Someone who looks on. <i>A crowd of fascinated <b>onlookers</b>.</i>
<b><u>peek</u></b>	Look quickly or furtively. <i>I only <b>peeked</b> I didn't see anything interesting.</i>
<b>probation</b>	(law) a way of dealing with offenders without imprisoning them; a defendant found guilty of a crime is released by the court without imprisonment subject to conditions imposed by the court. <i><b>Probation</b> is part of the sentencing process.</i>
<b><u>rummage</u></b>	Search unsystematically and untidily through something. <i>Open up the box and have a <b>rummage</b> around.</i>
<b>searching</b>	Having keenness and forcefulness and penetration in thought, expression, or intellect. <i>You have to ask yourselves some <b>searching</b> questions.</i>
<b><u>seem</u></b>	Seem to be true probable or apparent. <i>He couldn't <b>seem</b> to remember his lines.</i>
<b>sidelong</b>	To or from one side; sideways. <i>He looked <b>sidelong</b> at her with a quick smile.</i>
<b>sideways</b>	At an angle. <i>Leaning <b>sideways</b>.</i>
<b><u>smug</u></b>	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>A <b>smug</b> glow of self-congratulation.</i>
<b>squint</b>	The act of squinting looking with the eyes partly closed. <i>I had a bad <b>squint</b>.</i>
<b><u>stare</u></b>	Fixate one's eyes. <i>The students <b>stared</b> at the teacher with amazement.</i>
<b><u>staring</u></b>	Open and fixed as if in fear or wonder. <i><b>Staring</b> eyes.</i>

**watch**

A watchman or group of watchmen who patrolled and guarded the streets of a town before the introduction of the police force.

*In spring and summer **watch** for kingfishers.*
