## Associations of "Look like" (30 Words)

<a href="#">akin</a>	Of similar character. <i>A feeling <b>akin</b> to terror.</i>
<b>alike</b>	(of two or more people or things) similar to each other. <i>They dressed <b>alike</b> in black trousers and jackets.</i>
<b>appearance</b>	Formal attendance (in court or at a hearing) of a party in an action. <i>The <b>appearance</b> of the railway.</i>
<a href="#">askance</a>	With suspicion or disapproval. <i>The reformers looked <b>askance</b> at the mystical tradition.</i>
<a href="#">browse</a>	Shop around; not necessarily buying. <i>A moose needs to eat forty to fifty pounds of <b>browse</b> a day.</i>
<a href="#">comparable</a>	Conforming in every respect. <i>Nobody is <b>comparable</b> with this athlete.</i>
<b>conformable</b>	Disposed or willing to comply. <i>Plans <b>conformable</b> with your wishes.</i>
<b>contented</b>	Feeling or expressing happiness or satisfaction. <i>A <b>contented</b> smile.</i>
<a href="#">disapproving</a>	Expressing or manifesting disapproval. <i>He shot a <b>disapproving</b> glance at her.</i>
<b>funny</b>	A joke or witty remark. <i>They have some <b>funny</b> ideas about war.</i>
<a href="#">gaze</a>	Look steadily and intently, especially in admiration, surprise, or thought. <i>The male <b>gaze</b>.</i>
<b>glance</b>	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. <i>Sunlight <b>glanced</b> off the curved body of a dolphin.</i>
<b>identify</b>	Give the name or identifying characteristics of refer to by name or some other identifying characteristic property. <i>3.2% of the men identified as gay or bisexual.</i>

<b>likeness</b>	Similarity in appearance or character or nature between persons or things. <i>Man created God in his own <b>likeness</b>.</i>
<b>peek</b>	Throw a glance at; take a brief look at. <i>His socks were so full of holes his toes <b>peeked</b> through.</i>
<b>pro</b>	A prostitute. A <b>pro</b> golfer.
<b>quasi</b>	Having some resemblance. A <b>quasi</b> success.
<b>resemblance</b>	A way in which two or more things are alike. <i>The physical <b>resemblances</b> between humans and apes.</i>
<b>rummage</b>	A jumble of things to be given away. <i>Mick <b>rummaged</b> up his skateboard.</i>
<b>searching</b>	Exploring thoroughly. <i>A <b>searching</b> investigation of their past dealings.</i>
<b>semblance</b>	Resemblance similarity. <i>She tried to force her thoughts back into some <b>semblance</b> of order.</i>
<b>sidelong</b>	(used especially of glances) directed to one side with or as if with doubt or suspicion or envy. <i>Shot out <b>sidelong</b> boughs.</i>
<b>sideways</b>	By an indirect way. <i>He hurried towards his office without a <b>sideways</b> glance.</i>
<b>similarity</b>	The quality of being similar. <i>The <b>similarity</b> of symptoms makes them hard to diagnose.</i>
<b>similitude</b>	The quality or state of being similar to something. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply <b>similitude</b>.</i>
<b>smug</b>	Having or showing an excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements. <i>He was feeling <b>smug</b> after his win.</i>
<b>squint</b>	Be cross eyed have a squint or strabismus. <i>I had a bad <b>squint</b>.</i>
<b>stare</b>	(of a person's eyes) be wide open, with a fixed or vacant expression. <i>The obituaries <b>stared</b> out at us.</i>
<b>staring</b>	Open and fixed as if in fear or wonder. <i><b>Staring</b> eyes.</i>
<b>upside</b>	The more positive aspect of a situation. <i>Being self employed has its <b>upside</b>.</i>
