appear	Come into being or existence or appear on the scene. <i>This appears to be a very difficult problem.</i>
askance	Directed to one side with or as if with doubt or suspicion or envy- Elizabeth Bowen. <i>A waiter looked askance at his jeans.</i>
at	100 at equal 1 kip in Laos.
browse	Feed as in a meadow or pasture. <i>A browse through the sports pages.</i>
contented	Satisfied or showing satisfaction with things as they are. <i>I was never contented with half measures.</i>
emerge	Recover from or survive a difficult situation. <i>It emerged that the PM and the Chancellor are still at loggerheads.</i>
find	Get or find back recover the use of. <i>Find someone guilty.</i>
fixate	(in Freudian theory) arrest (a person or their libidinal energy) at an immature stage, causing an obsessive attachment. <i>Subjects fixated a central point.</i>
gape	A disease of birds with gaping of the mouth as a symptom caused by infestation with gapeworm. <i>A large duffel bag gaped open by her feet.</i>
gaze	A steady intent look. <i>The male gaze.</i>
glance	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. <i>She only glanced at the paper.</i>
glimpse	Catch a glimpse of or see briefly. <i>She caught a glimpse of the ocean.</i>
hairstyle	A particular way in which a person's hair is cut or arranged.

observing	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
onlooker	Someone who looks on. <i>A crowd of fascinated onlookers.</i>
peek	A secret look. <i>I only peeked I didn't see anything interesting.</i>
predominate	Appear very large or occupy a commanding position. <i>Hispanics predominate in this neighborhood.</i>
redundance	The attribute of being superfluous and unneeded.
rummage	An unsystematic and untidy search. <i>Mick rummaged up his skateboard.</i>
searching	Thoroughly scrutinizing, especially in a disconcerting way. <i>You have to ask yourselves some searching questions.</i>
see	Go to see for a social visit. <i>I can see a risk in this strategy.</i>
seem	Seem to be true probable or apparent. <i>It would seem that he has been fooling us all.</i>
sidelong	Inclining or directed to one side. <i>He looked sidelong at her with a quick smile.</i>
sideways	Denoting a job or position at the same level as one previously held rather than one resulting from promotion or demotion. <i>Turned sideways to show the profile.</i>
smug	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>He was feeling smug after his win.</i>
squint	The act of squinting looking with the eyes partly closed. <i>Melanie did not squint.</i>
stare	Be unpleasantly prominent or striking. <i>The students stared at the teacher with amazement.</i>
staring	(used of eyes) open and fixed as if in fear or wonder. <i>Staring eyes.</i>
visit	The act of visiting in an official capacity as for an inspection. <i>He shall visit earth in mercy.</i>
watch	See or watch. <i>I guess I can rest a while with you here to watch over me.</i>
