searching	Thoroughly scrutinizing, especially in a disconcerting way. You have to ask yourselves some searching questions.
<u>see</u>	Go to see for a social visit. I can see a risk in this strategy.
<u>seem</u>	Seem to be true probable or apparent. It would seem that he has been fooling us all.
sidelong	Inclining or directed to one side. <i>He looked sidelong at her with a quick smile.</i>
sideways	Denoting a job or position at the same level as one previously held rather than one resulting from promotion or demotion. <i>Turned sideways</i> to show the profile.
<u>smug</u>	Marked by excessive complacency or self-satisfaction. <i>He was feeling smug after his win.</i>
squint	The act of squinting looking with the eyes partly closed. <i>Melanie did not squint</i> .
<u>stare</u>	Be unpleasantly prominent or striking. The students stare d at the teacher with amazement.
<u>staring</u>	(used of eyes) open and fixed as if in fear or wonder. <i>Staring</i> eyes.
visit	The act of visiting in an official capacity as for an inspection. <i>He shall visit earth in mercy.</i>
<u>watch</u>	See or watch. I guess I can rest a while with you here to watch over me.
